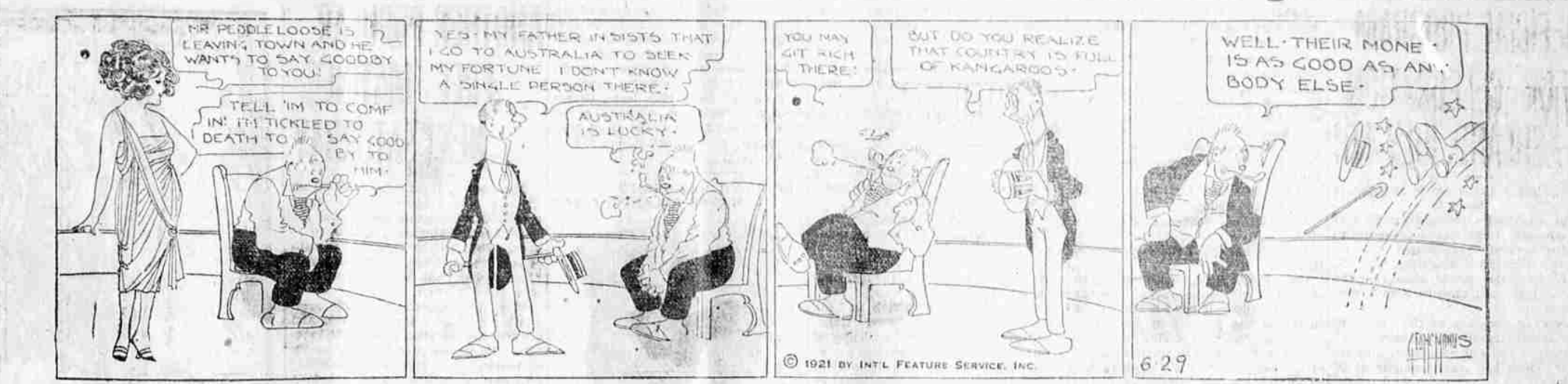
Leyle Carlton and two of his nieces, daughters of Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Carlton of Wellen, motored to our town Wednesday.
