### NO RECURRENCE OF LEPROSY AFTER OIL TREATMENTS

HONOLULU, T. H., June 29.—Some of the patients released on parole from the leprosy investigation station and hospital at Kalaheo, Hawaii, have failed to report at regular intervals, as they are required to do by the terms of their parole, and the board of health of the territory has issued an ultimatum that if this continues they will be brought back to the station and their permits to live at home canceled.

While not a single patient out of the scores paroled from Kalaheo has been returned, owing to recurrence of the disease, the authorities insist on keeping a strict check on those released. Board of health officers point out that, while the chaulmoogra oil treatment, as administered here, has proved that leprosy can be checked, time alone can establish whether a definite cure has been evolved.

In all their statements given to the Associated Press, Dr. A. J. Dean, president of the University of Hawaii, and the other scientists waging the battle against leprosy here have specifically said that the chaulmoogra oil treatment will check leprosy, and, while expressing the confident hope that it will ultimately result in a definite cure, they have carefully pointed out that this hope can be realized only by the test of time.

Following the resignation of Dr. J. T. McDonald, who has given years of his life to the fight against the disease, Kalaheo hospital, now in charge of Dr. H. E. Hasseltine, a biological expert sent out from Washington.

### SOUTH AMERICA WILL BE HAVEN RUSSIAN REDS

REVAL, Estonia, June.—According to recently intercepted correspondence from Communist officials in Moscow to communist agents abroad, advising them of the "inside situation" in Russia, South America is looked upon as a final haven of refuge for many of the best known Bolshevik leaders in event Russia becomes too hot for them.

One of these letters, recently published in a Reval newspaper, the Poslednie Novosti, advises one of the official's friends, who now is apparently in Germany, to "convert your valuables into dollars as frequently as you can, or better still, into South American currency."

"The Octobrists," the letter adds, meaning by them those communists who participated in the October, 1917 revolution, "are frequently sending their families abroad. Soon it may be, I shall send my wife across to you, in which case try to put her up as best you can."

Referring to the political situation this communist wrote: "Hitler (meaning Lenin, that being his middle name by which he is popularly known in Russia) is weakening. Zino, Yeff has grown too fat. Trotsky alone remains as of old the unrecognized Napoleon, but he is 'revolutionizing' also."

### CHRIST MARRIAGE IS VOTED DOWN

LONDON.—America was described as "the happy hunting ground of divorce" and "the home of divorcees" by the Rev. R. V. Magee, vicar of St. Mark's church, London, during a discussion of the divorce question by the London diocesan conference just ended. A resolution was adopted pledging the conference to adhere to the principle of the indissolubility of Christian marriage.

The Rev. Mr. Magee denounced Lord Buckmaster's bill in parliament for divorce reform, saying it could adequately be described in two titles, "Divorce While You Wait" and "Marriage on Trial for Six Months."

An amendment to the resolution that the conference should pledge itself to adhere "to the teaching of Jesus Christ concerning marriage" was lost.

Misses Langlen-Ryan Win. WIMBLEDON, June 29.—(By the Associated Press)—Miss Suzanne Langlen of France, and Miss Elizabeth Ryan of America, easily defeated Miss Shepard and Miss P. M. Hawkins of England in the semifinals of the women's doubles in the British turf championship tournament here this afternoon. The score was 6-2, 6-1.

### BELIEVE GEORGES WILL FIGHT JACK FROM THE START

NEW YORK, June 30.—Jack Dempsey and Georges Carpentier will meet in an eighteen foot ring which will be installed today in the Jersey City arena. This is the minimum sized arena permitted under the contract signed by the boxers. The maximum was 24 feet and sporting men both here and abroad expected that the Frenchman would argue vigorously for a platform that would give him more opportunity for the skillful footwork for which he is noted. The fact that no official protest has come from the Carpentier camp has given ground for rumors that the challenger intends to box Dempsey toe to toe.

Confusion arose last night over the size of the ring because of the fact that, although it will measure 18 feet from rope to rope, there will be an overhang of a foot or so to prevent the boxers being hurled from the stage.

### AERIAL BOMBERS POOR MARKSMEN

WASHINGTON, June 30.—Aerial bombers attacking the radio controlled battleship Iowa off the Maryland coast yesterday scored less than three per cent of hits, according to an official report to the navy department today from Vice Admiral Hilary P. Jones, in charge of the tests.

Admiral Jones said 70 bombs were dropped and that two struck the Iowa. Aviation experts of the army and navy were gratified at the success of the scouts in locating the Iowa as quickly as they did and were not discouraged by the low percentage of hits.

### SPORT FLASHES

BERKELEY—A. B. Sprott, half-back on the champion 1920 University of California football team will coach the freshman squad this season, it was announced.

SAN FRANCISCO—Charley Padock, star University of Southern California sprinter, may participate in an invitational track meet at Berkeley July 9th, if he holds up after the Pasadena national championship meet, according to word received here.

LOS ANGELES—Eighteen members of the New York Athletic club track and field team arrived yesterday, the advance guard of the athletes who will compete in the National A. U. meet that begins at Pasadena Saturday.

Showers in California. SAN FRANCISCO, June 29.—Slight showers, unusual for June in many localities, fell in the east states today and are expected by the United States weather bureau to continue tonight and tomorrow.

The showers will be too light to do any damage to crops, the bureau said.

### JACK DEMPSEY FAVORITE AMONG N. Y. SPORTSMEN

NEW YORK, June 30.—Jack Dempsey ruled the favorite among 165 sportmen out of 225 interviewed as to the probable outcome of the match. Fifty-eight predicted that the challenger would don the heavy weight belt, while a scattering few, including a college track trainer of considerable note said they expected the bout to be about even.

Men declaring for Carpentier generally declined to state, out and out that the Frenchman is their favorite. Their general opinion was that if the bout goes five rounds, Carpentier will outbox the champion for the remainder of the contest. The great majority professed to believe that Dempsey's hitting power will bring the battle to a sudden close if he can land.

Only a few were willing to predict that Carpentier will knock out the champion and those few demand long odds. Willie Lewis, veteran welterweight, whom Carpentier defeated in 20 rounds in France in 1917, was among the boxers who lined up with the European visitor.

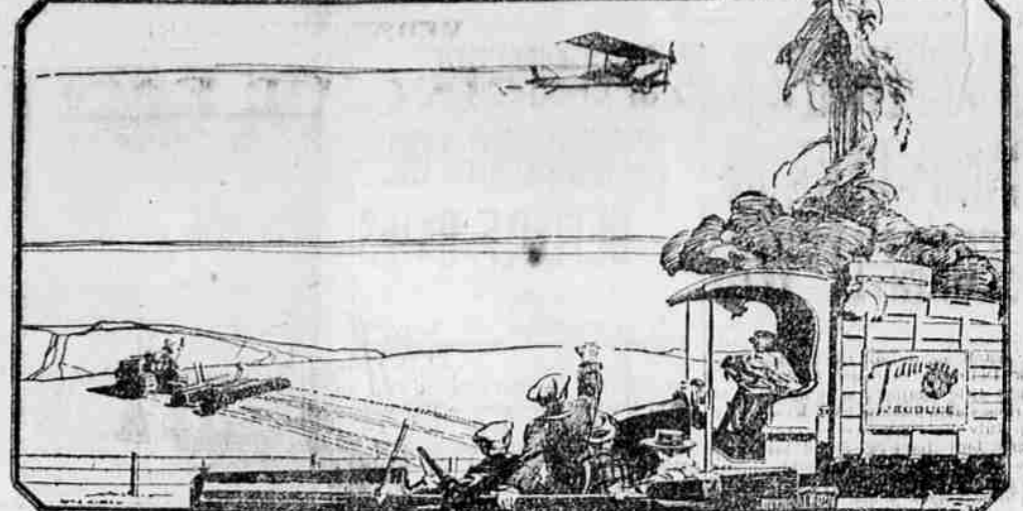

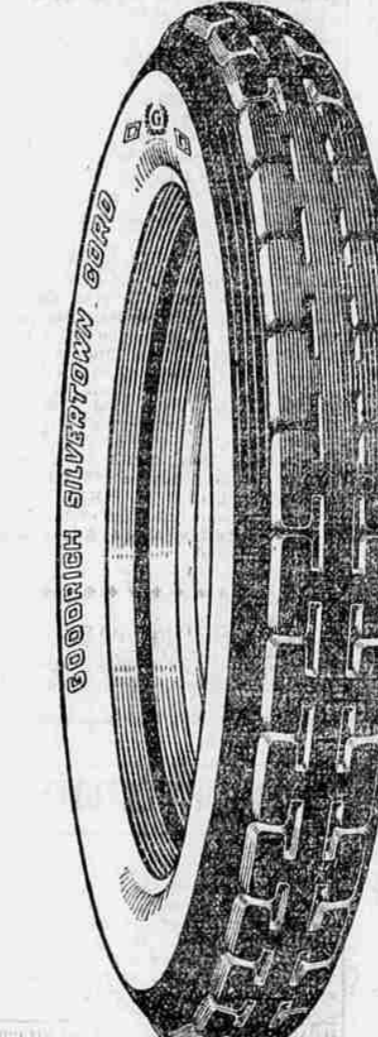
