HUNTERS WARNED QUAIL SEASON IS TO OPEN OCT. 15

The sportsmen of the city and county are warned by District Deputy Game Warden Patrick Dalley that the quail hunting season does not open tomorrow, as seems to be the general presumption, and that anybody who is found shooting quail before Oct. 15th will be prosecuted vigorously.

Originally the time for opening of the quail season was set for Oct. 1st, but the state fish and game commission at its last meeting, and as heretofore published, shortened the season by delaying the opening until Oct. 15. The season lasts until Nov. 1st. The bag limit is ten of the birds during seven consecutive days. There has been considerable grumbling about the shortening of the season among local sportsmen.

Mr. Dalley also calls attention to the fact that trappers' licenses have been raised by the game commission from \$1 a year to \$2.

SOUTHERN UTAH TOWNS SHAKEN BY EARTHQUAKE

SALT LAKE CITY, Sept. 30.—Reports received from Elsinore, one of the trio of small towns in the southern part of Utah shaken severely yesterday by earthquakes, reported another violent tremor at 7:30 this morning. The latest shock rendered more extensive the damage done yesterday. Practically every building in the little town was damaged and made untenable, according to latest reports. The damage at Elsinore, Richfield and Monroe was estimated at nearly \$100,000. So violent were the tremors that great sections of rock weighing thousands of tons tumbled down from cliffs in nearby canyons.

Twelve years ago the same section suffered property loss from a series of quakes.

ANTI-BEER BILL DELAYS ACTION ON PEACE PACTS

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30.—Champions of the anti-beer bill today threw an unexpected obstacle into the path of senate leaders' negotiations for a vote on the German, Austrian and Hungarian peace treaties October 14. The "drys" insisted that the provision for voting on their measure also be made.

BERLIN, Sept. 30.—(By Associated Press.) The reichstag today passed the bill ratifying the peace treaty with the United States. Only the communists voted against the measure.

The reichstag devoted less than ten minutes to the ratification formalities as all the parties, except the communists, agreed to dispense with debate. The bill approving the treaty was accepted in all three readings by an overwhelming majority, the nationalists also voting for its acceptance when Herr Loebe, president of the reichstag, called for a rising vote.

The passing by the German reichstag today of the bill ratifying the treaty of peace with the United States completes the executive process necessary to ratification on the part of Germany. The reichstag or upper chamber of the parliament, ratified the treaty on September 17.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30.—(By the Associated Press.)—Republican leaders of the senate expressed gratification today at the prompt ratification by the German reichstag of the peace treaty with Germany.

"I am very glad that the German government has acted so promptly," said Senator Lodge of Massachusetts, republican floor leader.
