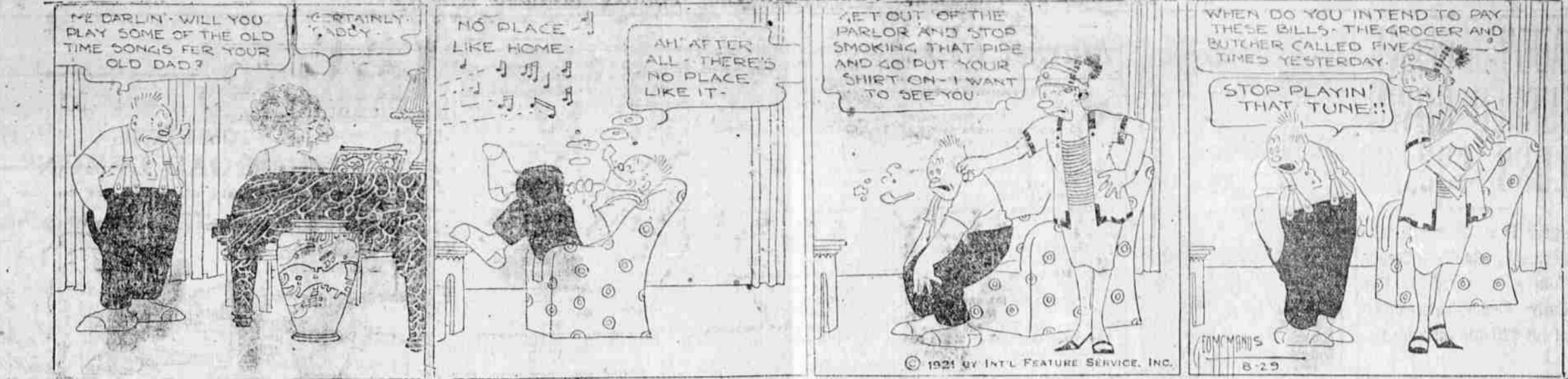

Steel Orders Increase. NEW YORK, Oct. 10.—The monthly tonnage report of the United States Steel corporation made public today showed 4,569,670 tons of unfilled orders on hand September 30. This is an increase of unfilled orders on hand August 31, which were 4,531,926 tons. This is the first increase in unfilled tonnage since July, 1921.
