Some entries have already been made one of which has been brought in from Butte Falls. This shows that the efforts of the committee have been successful in making the exposition of more than just local importance, one in which all localities of the Rogue River valley will participate.

One of the features of the exposition will be a drawing five by eight feet showing the county fair grounds and the contemplated buildings, roads and race track improvement.

Growers contemplating making entries must do so tomorrow as the judging will be done on Friday before the general public will be admitted. The exposition will be open for everyone to witness it on Saturday morning and arrangements are being made to have the doors remain open until ten o'clock that night.

PHOENIX SCHOOL NOTES

U. S. VETERANS' CLEAN UP SQUAD HERE NOVEMBER 9

The Oregon clean-up squad of the United States Veterans' bureau, which is touring the state to reach personally all ex-service men who have service claims, will be in Medford three days, November 9th, 10th and 11th.

The visit of the squad here is part of the nation-wide campaign of the U. S. Veterans' bureau to find and place in process of adjustment ex-service men's claims of every kind, including compensation, hospitalization, vocational training insurance, allotments, back pay, travel pay, Liberty bonds, victory medals, etc. Advice will be given on the reinstatement and conversion of war risk insurance, and the provision of the Street bill governing same will be explained.

In view of the fact that a large number of ex-service men will be in Medford for the Armistice day celebration it was agreed between A. C. Kinley, advance agent of the squad and officers of the Medford American Legion post and Red Cross chapter, that much good work could be accomplished if the squad remained here over Armistice day.

The personnel of the squad includes Cliff Wood, Portland, insurance and compensation expert; W. A. Wise, Seattle, vocational training official; Dr. G. L. Birchfield, Seattle, and Keith Higgins, Portland, Red Cross representative.

The medical officer will examine claimants, and in emergency cases is authorized to order immediate hospitalization or medical treatment.

Veterans who wish to get their old claims straightened out or file new ones should bring their discharge certificates or certified copies of same, together with any other papers they may have which relate to their claim to the Legion club rooms where the squad will make their headquarters during their stay here.

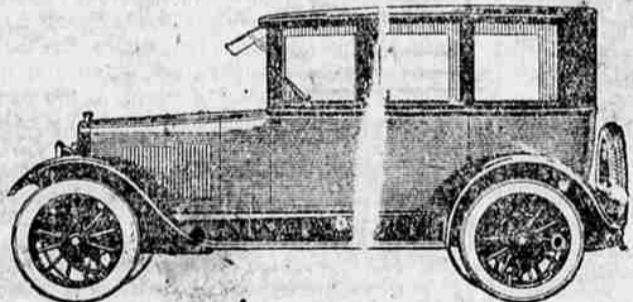
