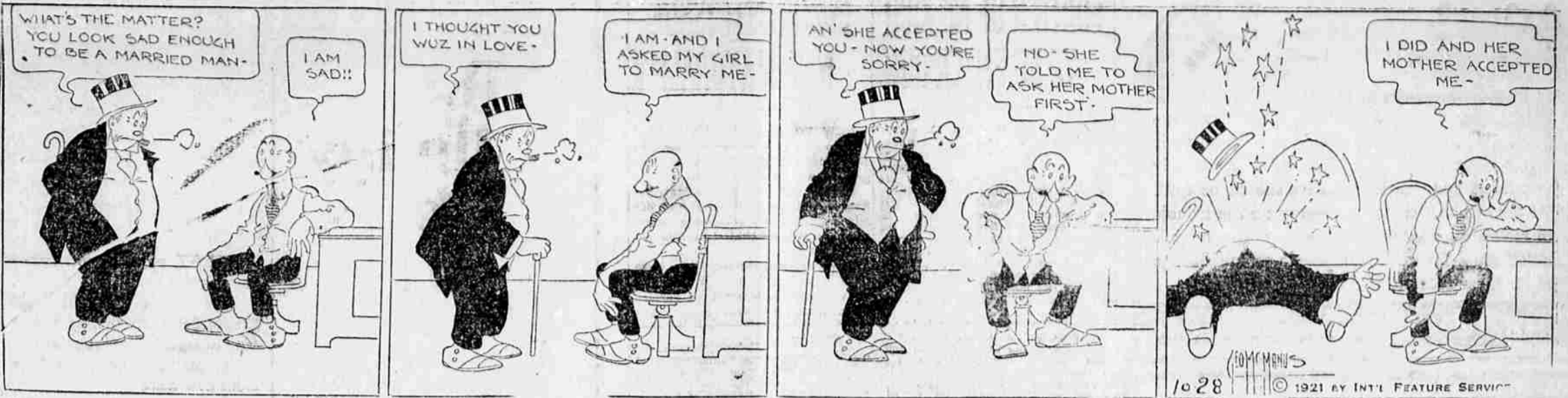


BRINGING UP FATHER
