

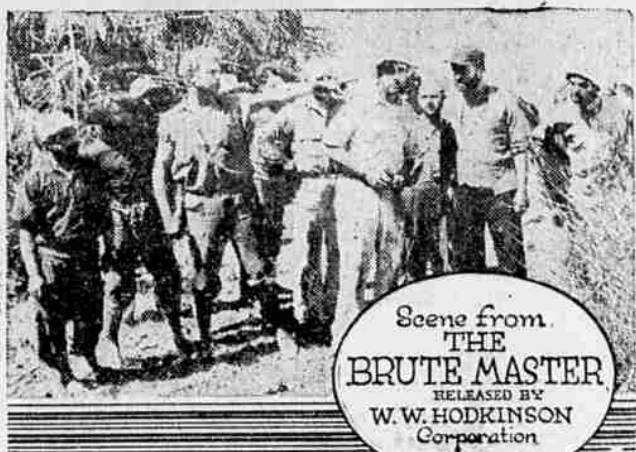
INTEREST IS KEEN IN BOXING BOUTS AT NAT TONIGHT

309 ENTRIES AT APPLE EXPOSITION, OPENS TOMORROW

The doors of the Rogue River Valley Apple Exposition open tomorrow morning to the general public and will remain open until ten o'clock in the evening. The exhibition will be maintained for as many months as the apples will remain suitable for that purpose.

There were 309 entries and it will take the judges until late this evening to complete the awarding of prizes. Apples shown at this exposition are undoubtedly of the finest quality and of the greatest number ever shown at any one time in the Rogue River valley. Taking into consideration the value of the apples and the labor employed by the growers in making the selections for the 130 boxes and the plate displays, the exhibit represents a value of several thousands of dollars.

In conducting the Rogue River Valley Apple exposition, the members of the Medford Chamber of Commerce had a number of objects in view. The most important one of which was the publicity that it would bring to the valley and assist the growers in the marketing of their product by the publicity that this exposition would give the traveling public.

Another object was that of educating the residents of this valley as to

the different kinds of apples grown and the peculiar characteristics of each.

The Apple exposition is a big success and by far outclasses any former attempt at displaying this attractive fruit.

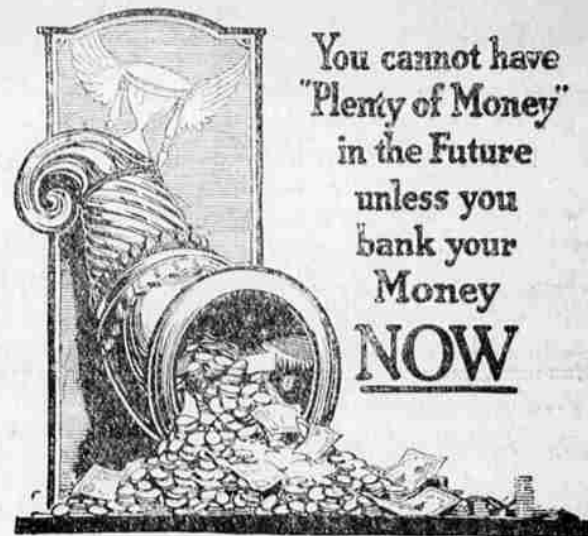
