"Two peculiar specimens of the finny tribe were displayed during the week end at the sporting goods store of Joe Wharton," says the Grants Pass Courier. "One is a cross between a steelhead and a cut-throat. The head, shape of the fins and tail resemble the steelhead, while the irregular markings and spots are those of the cut-throat. It was caught by Claude Hurdon. According to a story told Mr. Wharton, several years ago these two fish were crossed at the hatchery, and about 80,000 liberated. It is supposed, following the characteristics of the steelhead, these headed for salt water, and returned to spawn. While this is not the first one reported to have been caught, it is the first one displayed, and is rare in this vicinity. It weighed three pounds. The other fish is an out-and-out freak, of the steelhead variety. It had an extra long protruding under-jaw, with a blunt forehead. Regular nostrils are missing, but a large hole in the skull between the eyes evidently functioned for the absent organs."

Mr. Cowgill was feeling comparatively well today despite his many bruises and several fractured ribs—so good that he declared he expected to be out within a few days and look after some of his duties as engineer of the Medford irrigation system construction work.

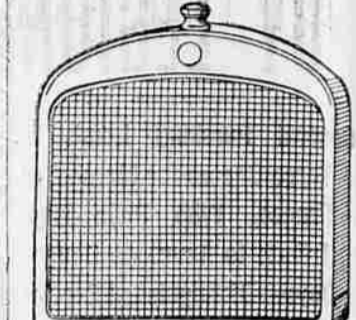
