D. O. K. K.'S GATHER IN MEDFORD FOR BIG CEREMONIAL

3858 PASSENGER AUTOMOBILES HERE

The distribution of the registrations up to September 15, 1921 shows that in Jackson county there were registered 16 motor vehicle dealers, 392 chauffeurs, 6221 motor vehicle operators, 67 motorcycles, 3858 passenger cars, 5 ambulances and hearses, 1 bus and stage, 127 commercial cars of less than one ton capacity, 298 trucks of from one to five tons capacity and 2 trailers of from one to five tons capacity, or a total of 4291 licensed passenger and commercial motor vehicles.

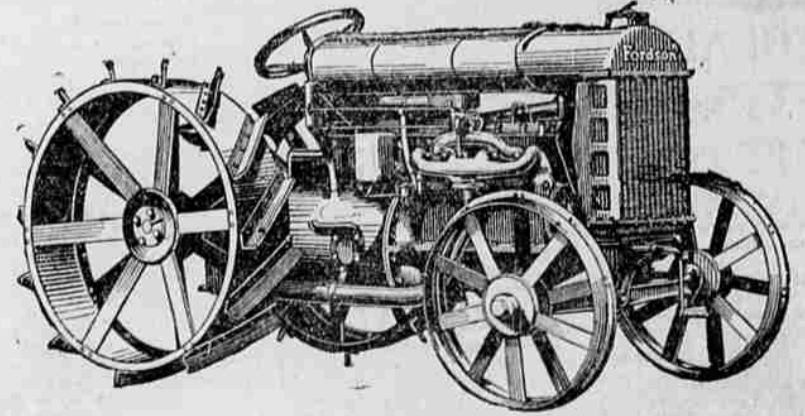
