Reductions in freight on many important articles moving between Pacific coast and Chicago, New York, Birmingham, Pittsburgh, St. Louis, Missouri river common points and other eastern territories are to be made at an early date according to an announcement made by J. H. Muchay, general freight agent of the Southern Pacific Co., Wednesday. The complete list of new rates and commodities affected are now being prepared and will soon be ready for distribution. The reductions range as high as 60 per cent on some of the articles, with a general average reduction of about 20 per cent. The Southern Pacific states it to be the largest and most important set of reductions to be made in transcontinental rates since the last general increase in freight rates granted by the railroads by the Interstate commerce commission in August, 1920.
