

### SOVIET CHILDREN LIVING LIKE WILD THINGS IN WOOD

RIGA, Nov. 3.—Children are living in the woods and fields like young animals, in some parts of the famine district of Saratov, says an official wireless dispatch from Moscow. They are little waifs who have fled from famine-stricken cities and villages and subsist on roots and grasses. When adults approach, they flee, showing every evidence of fear. Overcrowding of children's homes had been carried so far in the Syrzan and Ufa districts that some of the institutions are sheltering four times as many children as they have accommodation for. In these places children take turns in occupying such beds as are available, one small famine victim crawling into a bed the moment another child vacates it.

"Entire families are jumping into rivers and cases are reported of parents strangling their children rather than see them die by starvation," says the dispatch which also gives the first report of disorderly migration. "Over the roads in the Irbit district is moving a band of disorderly refugees from starving."

### CHARGES R. R.'S THROW TRADE TO FOREIGN SHIPS

NEW YORK, Nov. 3.—Foreign competition, "aided and abetted by Americans," was declared today by United States Senator Joseph E. Ransdell of Louisiana, in an address before the Advertising club, to be one of the "underlying causes that are crippling the development of the American merchant marine."

Nearly a score of American railroads, he said, including some of the greatest systems, have filed with the inter-state commerce commission copies of contracts in which they agreed to use their best efforts to secure freight "for foreign shipping companies to the exclusion of others."

Senator Ransdell cited as examples contracts between the Pennsylvania system and P. & W. W. & Co., a British corporation; between the Baltimore and Ohio railroad and the North German Lloyd line, and the Boston and Albany railroad and the Cunard line.

"Exclusive use of facilities is granted in many cases," the speaker said, "free wharfage and handling is given, special bills of lading are made and many other privileges accorded."

"The Boston and Albany railroad in its agreement with the Cunard line, grants the free and exclusive use of certain piers and in addition further pledged under certain conditions a reduced rate of 2 1/2 cents a hundred pounds for freight in car lots."

"As a result of the operation of the various contracts, well over a million tons of freight are turned over annually by American railroads to foreign ships. The most amazing aspect of the situation, however, is that the railroads, supplied with funds from the United States treasury, have been utilizing their resources to build up the business and swell the profits of foreign competitors of the government's shipping."

Enforcement of the merchant marine act of 1920, "and especially of those sections providing for the maintenance of new trade routes, equality of opportunity for American ports generally, preferential rail rates on shipments by American vessels and discriminating duties and tonnage duties" was recommended by Mr. Ransdell.

**DAN R. HANNA DIES  
AT SUMMER HOME**  
CLEVELAND, Nov. 3.—Dan R. Hanna, publisher of the Cleveland News and Cleveland Sunday Leader, and one of Cleveland's foremost business men, died of heart failure at his home, The Croft, Ossining, N. Y., early today, according to advices received here.

A son of the late United States Senator Marcus A. Hanna, he was born December 25, 1855 in Cleveland and is survived by his mother, Mrs. Marcus A. Hanna, of Washington; by two sisters, Mrs. Medill McCormick of Chicago, and Mrs. Harry A. Parsons of Cleveland, and by eight children.
