Sheriff Terrill and all other Oregon sheriffs are much interested in the test case now before the Oregon supreme court with the filing Wednesday of a mandamus action by Sheriff Zoeth Houser of Umatilla county, asking that the county court be compelled to pay expenses incurred by his office in making arrests. If the sheriff wins this action, other Oregon sheriffs can make like collections. The Umatilla county court recently received a ruling from Attorney General Van Winkle, stating that the sheriff could not collect an expense account from the court under the Oregon law for money expended in the rounding up of criminals. At the present time the sheriff is compelled to pay the expenses of his office from the collection of fees, money made from feeding prisoners and the \$2500 he is allowed from the county. The action of the sheriff is based upon the recent legislative act amending the state statutes.
