An average of 75 boxes a day are being mailed from the Hood river postoffice, and nearly 100 arrive daily over the Mount Hood railroad company's line from Parkdale, Odell and Dee. While the apples are being sent out in large quantities to Portland and points in western Washington, the bulk of them go to central and eastern Oregon points. Many growers ship heavy blocks of their fruit by parcel post to dealers in the towns of the interior.
