YOU CAN'T CHANGE THE LEOPARD.

AMBASSADOR HARVEY is running true to form. When he was named, we pointed out the dangers, and those dangers are now being realized.

He celebrated his arrival in London by telling why America entered the war, and the public condemnation of the American Legion is merely the culmination of a long series of rebuffs which his unfortunate utterance received.

Last Thursday he made another speech and proceeded to depart from his prepared address and commit another blunder. He announced that America would never consider an alliance with Great Britain, and took occasion to reprimand Lord Derby for making such a suggestion.

Whether Ambassador Harvey was right or wrong, makes little difference. As a matter of fact he was probably right. But it is not the American ambassador's province to outline American policy.

That such a declaration of policy was not authorized is certain. Just as it is certain that the pronouncement concerning America's reason for entering the war, was not authorized.

More than that. In both instances the implications involved threaten to seriously embarrass the administration he represents.

The effect of his first statement will be to strengthen the impression abroad that Uncle Sam puts money above everything, that his professed idealism is bunk, that only fear of his skin, impelled him to enter the war and would impel him to enter another.

The effect of the second statement will be to encourage anti-British propaganda in this country, stimulate the pestiferous Sinn Feiners, complicate a situation which is already delicate, and render difficult an understanding between England and America, which is absolutely essential to world peace and the betterment of world conditions.

America and Great Britain will probably never enter into a formal alliance, but the English speaking peoples, with kindred ideals and similar traditions, must go forward hand in hand if what we call civilization is to be preserved.

The answer is Ambassador Harvey is not a diplomat and never should have been given a diplomatic post. He is a militant political propagandist, aggressive, malicious and vindictive, and his place is on the political stump or in an editorial bomb proof, not at the Court of St. James.
