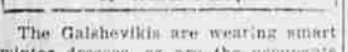

THE NON-PARTISANS ARRIVE.

WE HAVE been requested to mention a mass meeting of the Non-Partisan league at Portland November 15th at the Labor Temple.

The request is granted. We trust there will be a large gathering on hand, and a complete exposition of what the Non-Partisan league is and what it has done.

Among the items on the agenda are the following: Should the co-operators control the political state?

Why is it necessary for the producer to control the industrial government?

Can the farmer and labor organizations depend upon lobbying for legislation?

Why should the farmer pay a membership fee in the league?

The following answers are suggested: No.

It isn't.

They can.

He shouldn't.

But the plainest lesson in human experience today, is that betterment can only come, through evolution, not revolution, that granting the imperfections of the system we have, its perpetuation is preferable to its destruction, when there is no workable system to take its place.

We have no quarrel with those who favor a Non-Partisan mass meeting in Portland. This is a free country. The man who believes in Non-Partisanship as practiced in North Dakota, has as much right to be heard, as the man who believes in Dowicism or Voodooism or any other ism.

Let the Non-Partisan crusaders be heard. If they tell the truth to harm can be done. If they don't tell the truth, only the easy marks can be deluded. And we have yet to be convinced there are any more easy marks in Oregon, than in any other part of the country, not overlooking our present shirring example, North Dakota.

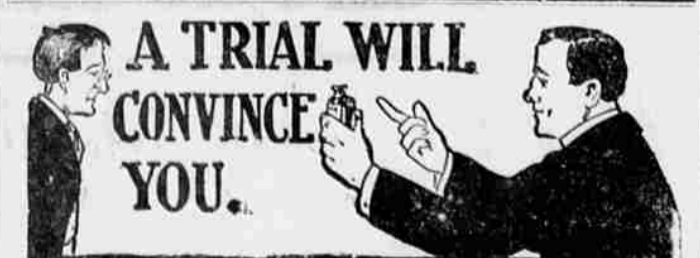

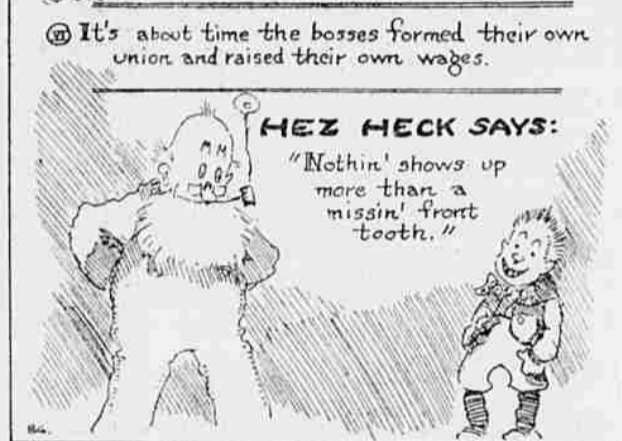
