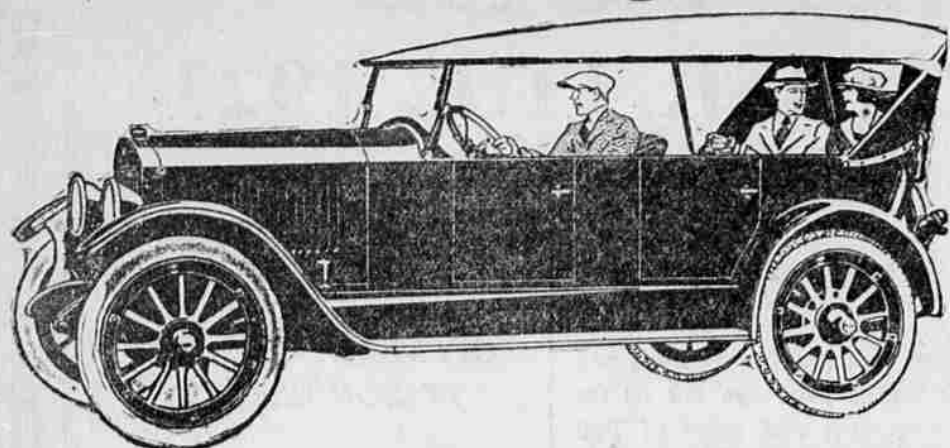

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WILL DEDICATE WAR MEMORIAL AT ASHLAND HI

ASHLAND, Nov. 9.—We have several memorials in place to honor local soldier boys who lost their lives incident to the world war but a specific one will be the bronze tablet honoring six local high school boys. Three were killed in action while overseas, Walter Phillips, aviator; Clement Summers, engineer corps; Raymond Morgan, marine corps, Algie Loomis, Jack Decker, and Forrest Wolcott, died while in training at Fort Stevens. The tablet will be forty inches high and twenty-four inches wide, suitably engraved. Appropriately, its position will be located on the right wall of the high school entrance. This memorial is of milled bronze, and is the handiwork of Robert Keller, fellow high school student, now pursuing engineering studies at the University of Oregon. Ashland Post of the American Legion will participate with the high school alumni association in the service, the school board and student body also to be in attendance. As representing the alumni association, Prof. Vining will deliver the main address. Supt. Briscoe, Glenn Simpson, R. L. Burdick, S. A. Peters, Jr., Ed Dunn and James Spencer are a committee attending to program and other details. The exercises will begin promptly at 11 a. m. and be over by noon on Friday, Nov. 11. Citizens in general are urged to attend. Providing weather is inclement, the exercises will be held within the building, otherwise on the lawn.

"The Ashland High School Song and Yell Book" is the title of a neat little booklet containing a score or more of robust vociferations in keeping with lively operations on the athletic domain, both indoors and out. Grant Selby is the present yell leader, having for assistants Marjory McElvaney and Thelma Heer.

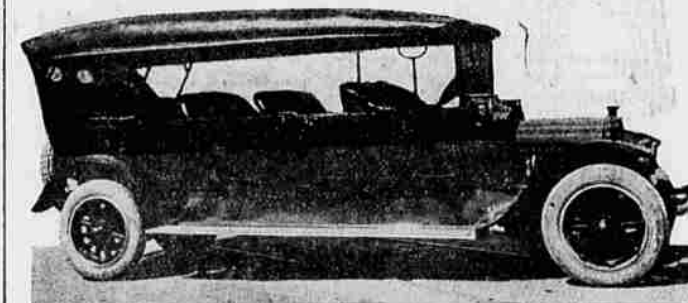
