THE NEW YORK ELECTION.

A MAJORITY of the people of New York City don't want good government. That is what the record-breaking victory of Mayor Hylan means.

New York had good government under Mitchell and decisively beaten. New York had inefficient and dishonest government under Hylan and a promise of efficient and honest government under Curran, and the Tammany landslide resulted.

Tammany will continue to rule until one of two things happens—either a municipal scandal of such proportions that public apathy will be overcome in an avalanche of public indignation, or the anti-Tammany forces will acquire some political sense and evolve a political machine that can meet the Tiger on his own ground.

In the present campaign as in the history of its predecessors, Tammany had a corner on political shrewdness and efficient organization. With a candidate personally popular and eminently respectable, the appeals and corruption skillfully hidden, by adroit and effective, waste to class prejudice, Curran was beaten before he started.

In spite of all it could do the coalition party could not escape the damning label of the silk stocking. It could not get within a thousand miles of the man in the street either in its personnel or promises.
