FIND MISSING GIRL IN STILLAGUAMISH

EVERETT, Wash., Nov. 14.—The body of Dorothy Grimm, missing since Saturday noon, was found this morning in a deep pool of the Stillaguamish river a quarter of a mile below the swinging bridge over the stream on which her sweater was found. Miss Grimm, 18 years old, Saturday morning left camp in the mountains about thirty miles from here to go to the nearby station at Tyree, across the river. She never returned. Since Saturday searching parties have been looking for her.

Gladly accepting, therefore, the proposal in principle, Japan is ready to proceed with determination to a sweeping reduction in her naval armament. It will be universally admitted that a nation must be provided with such arrangements as are essential to its security. This requirement must be fully weighed in the examination of the plan. With this requirement in view certain modifications will be proposed with regard to the tonnage basis for replacement of various classes of vessels. This subject should be referred for special consideration by naval experts. When such modifications are proposed, I know that the American and other delegates will consider them with the same desire to meet our ideas as we have to meet theirs.

RATE FAVORITISM IN TEXAS PORTS IS PROTESTED

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 15.—Increases in freight rates on cotton from southern states to coast ports for export several years ago diverted most of the shipments to Gulf of Mexico ports, particularly Galveston, witnesses declared here today before an inter-state commerce commission member who is hearing a petition of Pacific coast shipping men for an equalized rate.
