INDIA REVOLTERS LOSE HEAVY IN GARRISON FIGHT. DELHI, India, Nov. 15.—Nearly seven hundred Mohlan rebels were killed in an attack on the Panditkhal post, which was repulsed by the Gurkha garrison. The British force numbered two thousand. One British officer and three men were killed and 24 wounded. LONDON, Nov. 14.—The British deputy commissioner in Calcutta and sixteen policemen were injured while suppressing a riot led by the runaway strikers, according to official advices. Several of the rioters were also injured. No shots were fired.
