## SHRINE TO HOLD BIG CEREMONIAL ASHLAND, DEC. 2

ASHLAND, Ore., Nov. 16.—The Shrine will shine here on Friday, December 2, that date having been set for a ceremonial, designated in the social calendar's entertainment events as "Hillab's Humdinger Homecoming" for the autumn season of 1921. The committee on invitation, outside of Ashland, includes North Harvey, Cottage Grove; C. O. Porter, Dunn; Dr. R. T. Burnett, Eugene; Geo. S. Calhoun, Grants Pass; J. E. Kimball, Klamath Falls; R. D. Williams, Roseburg; while the list in neighboring Jackson county towns includes Frank J. Newman and J. F. Hiltson, Medford; Fred Fick and Emil Britt, Jacksonville; W. C. Leever, Central Point. In fact, the membership in general are to spread the news and solicit a big attendance. Locally the executive committee consists of G. W. Dunn, F. D. Wagner and O. Winter. The traditional banquet will be in order, and T. H. Simpson, A. E. Kinney and C. C. Weisenburger will supervise the refreshment service. Carl Tengwald, of Medford, will look after the decorations, while Andy McCallen and Bob Warner will see to it that musical accompaniments are supplied. The event will take place in the Armory, Friday afternoon, December 2, with a business session at 2, parade at 3, first section at 4, banquet at 6, and second section finale at 8; an informal dance possibly figuring as an aftermath. Banquet at Elks' spacious dining rooms. The bazaar of the Eastern Star, held under auspices of its embroidery club, will be housed in Masonic hall on Friday of this week, Nov. 18, the public in general being invited to call and inspect the display. Lunch will be served from 1 to 9 p. m., and card tables will be available free to white away the evening hours. The exhibit will be fine and comprehensive, combining the ornamental and useful, with some notably elaborate specimens in the line of fancy work. No less than half a dozen departments will be represented in the real of domestic arts.

## GERMAN EXPLOSION KILLS 12, HURTS 40

MAYENCE, Nov. 16.—Twelve people were killed and sixty injured in an explosion in a factory at Dolzheim, a short distance from Weisbaden, Prussia. The damage to the factory is estimated at 25,000,000 marks. Dolzheim is 40 miles north of Oppau, where an explosion in a plant of the Badische Anilin concern on September 21, killed 1800 persons, injured about 4000 others and laid in waste the entire factory and the village to Oppau.

Suwanee Special Wrecked  
CHATTANOOGA, Tenn., Nov. 15.—The Suwanee special on the Cincinnati Southern from Chicago to Jacksonville was wrecked early today at Spring City, 65 miles north of Chattanooga. Four or five persons were reported injured, none seriously.
