JACKSON COUNTY BUDGET NOTICE

Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 118 General Laws of Oregon, 1921, notice is hereby given that the County Court of Jackson County, Oregon, will meet in the Circuit Court Room of the Court House in the City of Jackson, Oregon, on Thursday, the 8th day of December, 1921, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock a. m. of said day, and at the said time and place opportunity will be given for a full and complete discussion of the estimate of the amount of money proposed to be raised by taxation for the ensuing year, as published herewith, by any taxpayer subject to such tax levy when made, in favor of or against any of the proposed tax levies herein as the County Court may deem for the best interests of Jackson County.

The County Budget Committee for Jackson County, Oregon, has prepared and submits the following: An estimate of the amount required for each department of County Government, County Office or County Officer, each County improvement, the maintenance of each County building, structure or institution, the salary of each County officer or employee, including those whose salaries are fixed by statute, for the improvement and maintenance of public highways, roads, bridges, the construction, operation and maintenance of each public utility and redemption of outstanding warrants; and estimate of the public receipts of the County from sources other than direct taxation upon the real and personal property in the County during the period for which such tax is to be levied and the amount of balances on hand in the funds of the County at the time the levy will be made.

Table of Expenses: Crater Lake Highway Bond Interest, Pacific Highway Road Interest Fund, General Road Fund, County School Fund, School Library Fund, etc.

Table of General County Fund: For Payment of State Tax (estimate only 11 mills), Market Road Money (1.5 mills), Circuit Court, County Court and Commissioners, County Judge's salary, etc.

Table of Juvenile Court: For the payment of State Tax, Sheriff's Office, Sheriff's salary, telephone and telegraph, fingerprint work and photo supplies, etc.

Table of Court House: Salary of assessor, traveling expenses, board of prisoners, repairs, supplies, etc.

Table of Assessor's Office: Salary of assessor, traveling expenses, board of prisoners, repairs, supplies, etc.

Table of Clerk's Office: Salary of clerk, traveling expenses, board of prisoners, repairs, supplies, etc.

Table of Coroner's Office: Fees of coroner and physicians, jurors, witnesses and other expenses.

Table of Fruit Inspectors: Payment to state for extension work, county agent, demonstration agent.

Table of School Superintendent's Office and Department of Education: Salary of superintendent, clerical assistance, traveling expense, etc.

Table of Sealer of Weights and Measures: Salary and traveling expenses.

Table of Stock Inspector: Salary and expenses and tubercular cattle.

Table of Water Master: Salary of water master, assistant, mileage, misc. expenses.

Table of Surveyor's Office: Surveyor's salary, stenographer, misc. expenses.

Table of Treasurer's Office: Treasurer's salary, traveling expense, deputy, extra help, misc. expenses, etc.

Table of Miscellaneous Expenses: Emergency fund, County Library outside of City of Ashland, Fire warden, one-third expense, 1921, Elections and registrations, etc.

Table of State Appropriation for County Fair: Total State of Oregon, County of Jackson, ss. From rent of forest, From 5 per cent sale of timber, Penalties and interest on delinquent taxes, Auto licenses.

We, the undersigned, County Budget Committee for Jackson County, Oregon, do hereby certify that the above is a true, fair and complete estimate of the probable expenses of said county for the ensuing year and available receipts from sources other than direct taxation upon real and personal property in its jurisdiction during the ensuing year.

We further certify that the estimate of expenses of the various institutions of the County, of the amount required for public enterprises, roads, bridges, etc., and of all other expenses of the county as therein set out, has been based upon a careful study of the expenses of the county during the past 3 years, and a thorough examination of its probable needs during the year for which such estimate is made. That each and every item therein is believed to be necessary for the proper transaction of the business of the county, the protection of its property and interests and to be for the public welfare. That every expense estimated is in accordance with law, and is a legitimate charge against the county.
