NEW PROCESS IN STEEL INDUSTRY AID TO COAST

NEW YORK, Nov. 18.—Manufacture of steel from iron ore by the "direct process" which would involve the use of atomized fuel oil, or powdered coal, was described before the American Institute today by A. E. Bourcound, a New York engineer...

The process described by Mr. Bourcound differs from the blast furnace process in that the latter involves the use of reduction gases formed in the charge of coke in the furnace...

It was pointed out by the speaker that the "direct process" would open up possibilities for the development of a steel industry in regions where blast furnace operations are almost impossible because of the cost of supplying coal to plants.
