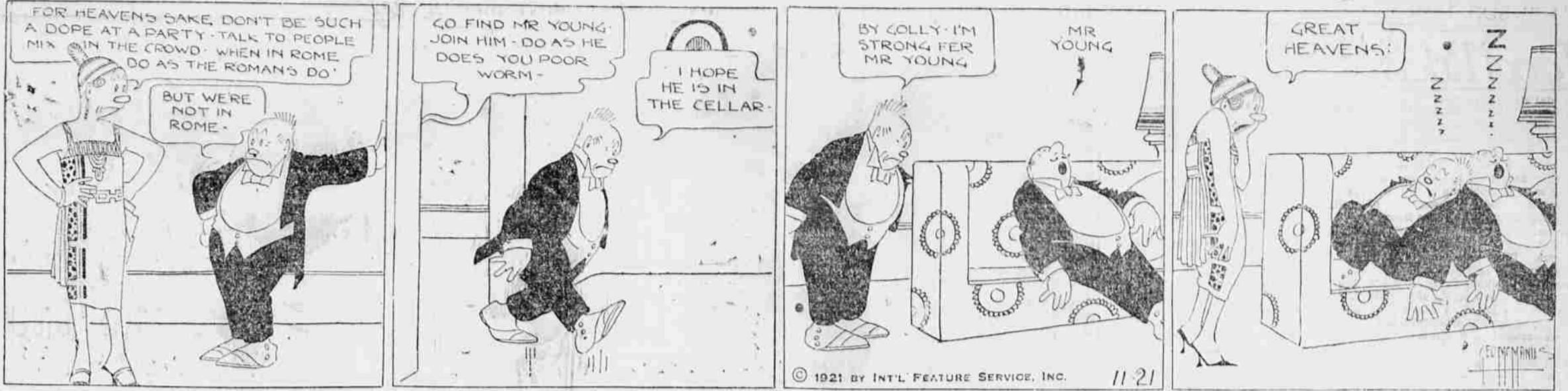

ANCIENT CUSTOM 'PRAY TO DEATH' HAWAIIAN BELIEF

HONOLULU, Nov. 5.—(By Mail.)—The ancient Hawaiian belief that a person can be "prayed to death" if the "kahuna" or medicine man has something in his possession that once belonged to the patient, still lives. It was revealed here when Moke Kalawa was arrested on a charge of "manaia" meaning an attempt to "pray to death." The complaint against Kalawa, said to be one of the best known "medicine men" in the Hawaiian islands and credited with having accomplished some remarkable cures, was made by Mrs. Frank Kalua, wife of a territorial land office clerk. Mrs. Kalua, according to her husband, was taken ill about a month ago. She refused to be treated by a licensed physician and placed herself under Kalawa's care, he said. She seemed to recover until Kalawa in a fit to have cut off some of her hair, when she became seriously ill. Mrs. Kalua, frightened, waited anxiously for Kalawa and when he failed to appear on his weekly calling day, she went to a hospital, where it was necessary to perform an operation. She is recovering. The warrant and Kalawa's arrest followed. Much interest is being displayed in his coming trial, the first in the territory in years on charge of "manaia."
