**HIGH POWER WIRE BLOWN DOWN, IS RESCUED BY FORD**

A light pole on the southwest corner of the intersection of South Ivy and Tenth streets was blown over by the wind last evening allowing the street light at that corner to descend within seven or eight feet of the ground. The top of the pole was kept clear of the ground only by the power line which it was supposed to support and which carried a charge of 4,000 volts for street lighting purposes.

William Stinson and three other employees of the California-Oregon Power company arrived on the scene at about eight o'clock and placed the pole in a perpendicular position with the aid of some of the spiked poles generally used for that purpose and a Ford roadster belonging to the company. The top of the pole was hitched to the flivver with the aid of a length of rope and the little car pulled the pole into an upright position, after which the rope was snubbed around a nearby tree for the night.

The 4,000 volt line of the street lighting circuit was a menace to the traffic.
