Objections of Ivan E. Kilgore to the government's cost bill submitted in his trial, and Kilgore's request that the costs be apportioned, met with failure Monday at the hands of Federal Judge Bean. Judgment was given against Kilgore in the Medford term of the federal court by the government for allowing his cattle to graze in the national forest without securing a permit from the government. Under the law the United States attorney is allowed to charge double the actual costs of docketing charges. All Judge Bean did for Kilgore was to reduce the government \$40 docketing charge to \$20, the actual cost. Witness fees to which Kilgore objected were ordered paid.—Portland Journal.
