COMMUNITY DUTY TO NEW PROJECTS TOLD TO CRATERS

Senator C. M. Thomas was speaker of the evening at the regular meeting of the Craters club last night. The principal part of Mr. Thomas' address was given to the subject of "Community Responsibility," which he handled in a most interesting way. The speaker pointed out that every man owed a duty of community service and utterly failed as a citizen if he refused to give service, because he enjoyed the benefits which do come to each community and each individual member because of the efforts of his fellow.

The man who fails to accept and give community service is a community liability. Discussing one of the vital problems now facing the community, viz: The necessity of aiding the rancher to work out his difficulties after the completion of the construction work on the irrigation districts now building, Senator Thomas said: "Gold Hill district has been completed more than a year; Grants Pass district is just finishing; Medford district is building; Talent district has finished its west side unit and is about ready to build its immense dam and reservoir; Eagle Point district is ready to build. The successful completion of these projects will bring an immense amount of fertile soil under permanent water and spell prosperity for this community. Each land owner will have his distinct problems.

"Chances like the Crater and Chamber of Commerce can aid bringing the prospective settler to the owner who may desire to sell either all or a portion of his lands; by aiding the assembling and use of a revolving fund to provide finance in channels out of the ordinary; and by assisting in getting industries located here that will provide a profitable market for the products of the ranch."

Mr. Thomas referred to a California district that was aided by one citizen who individually aided many of the ranchers to purchase dairy cows by purchasing the cows, retaining the title, and permitting the rancher to pay out of a portion of the cream checks. Thus one man with a comparatively small amount of money was of great help to his neighbors.

URGE ADOPTION UNIT PLAN, JACK. COUNTY SCHOOL

At a recent meeting of the board of control of Jackson county division of the State Teachers association held in Medford at which all members were present with the exception of H. P. Jewett of Talent, vice president, it was decided to join forces with the county superintendent in pushing the matter of the adoption in Jackson county of the unit plan of school administration and taxation. This board of control consists of the officers and one elected member of the Jackson Unit of the O. S. T. A. They include: Supt. George A. Briscoe of Ashland, president; Principal H. P. Jewett of Talent, vice president; Ray Henderson of Central Point, secretary; Miss Susan W. Honies, county superintendent, ex-officio member, Mrs. Mina Allen of Rich, elected member. They appointed a campaign committee to work in conjunction with the county superintendent to get this measure on the ballot next election, which will be held at the time of the primaries next May. The committee consists of County Superintendent Honies, chairman; Principal E. H. Hedrick, Central Point; Principal H. P. Jewett, Talent; Principal Alameda Fuller, Sams Valley; Principal E. W. Jacobson, Rogue River.

NO SMALL ENVELOPES IN CHRISTMAS MAIL

Incidental to the coming Christmas rush of mail the postoffice department is waging a war against the use of small-sized envelopes and has put out the following statement in part:

During the holiday season large quantities of very small envelopes and cards are put into the mails with the result that all postal work is very much retarded and mail disfigured and mutilated. This is not generally known to the public. The minimum size of cards and envelopes should not be below 2 1/4 by 4 inches for the following reasons:

1. Addresses will be obliterated by cancellation mark.
2. Too small to be run through facing table, necessitating three extra handlings with consequent delay not only to this but other mail.
3. Delay in cancellation because of awkwardness in putting through cancelling machines.
4. Delayed through difficulty in sorting.
5. Liability to loss or damage as small sizes do not fit letter packages and can not be tied securely.

These odd and diminutive sized pieces of stationery have come into use in the past few years and only appear now in any quantities at Christmas time when the whole postal institution is keyed up to top speed and trying to keep on top of the load.

ANHWEI GOVERNOR PRO-JAP, AGED, LASTS 3 DAYS

PEKING, Oct. 23.—(By Mail)—Opposition by the people of the Province of Anhwei to their new civil governor has caused that official to go into sudden retirement after only three days in office, according to official reports received in Peking from the capital of the province.

Objection of the Anhwei people to the new governor, one Li Shao-chien, was due to his great age and the fact that he has, in the past, been connected with the pro-Japanese Anfu party. So the students, gentry and merchants of Anhwei arranged for a reception committee which was to give Li a warm welcome on his arrival at Anking on September 20.

Li, however, got advance word of the welcome that was being planned for him and so travelled to Anking, the provincial capital, on a gunboat. He landed at a point below the town with a strong body guard and, entering the city through a little used gate, reached his official residence while the "reception committee" was still waiting at the regular landing stage and wondering why he didn't arrive.

It is learned here, however, that the reception for Governor, or ex-Governor, Li was postponed, but not cancelled, and that on September 23 the aged official departed for places unknown because the reins of government in Anhwei got too hot for him to handle.

Peking is now looking for another civil governor to send to Anking, and this time, it is said, the government will first consult the people of Anhwei.

NEW YORK, Nov. 23.—Four active members of the Tile, Grate and Manifold Manufacturers and Dealers' Association, who were among those who pleaded guilty last week to violating the Sherman anti-trust law, today were given jail sentences by Federal Judge Van Fleet. F. H. Nobbe, Arthur Shilstone and Albert Schaffo were sentenced to four months in the Essex county (New Jersey) jail and fined \$1,900 each. Herman Petri was sentenced to two months in the same jail and fined \$2,500.
