MANY SEE BAILING OPERATIONS, GOOD TRIGONIA SHOWING

Many visitors at the Trigonias oil well were present all day Wednesday and about twenty people interested in the development of the project were present in the afternoon about 4:20 while the process of bailing was in progress. Every time the bailer was brought up the gas and thick black oil were discernible on the water column which rushed from the orifice of the casing and when the bailer was emptied into the drain large globular particles of thick crude oil which had been chilled by the water were seen floating on it, coating the surface of the water with an oil scum. Many people who have been spectators at the well for several days express the opinion that the showing is increasing, but officials of the company and members of the drilling crew will not commit themselves by offering a definite opinion. However that a noticeable quantity of oil is brought up in each bailer is a certainty. A new bailer was put on the cable Wednesday morning and was let down into the well whereupon a digger squirrel which had made his winter's nest in the bailer came up the line with considerable velocity narrowly escaping a watery and oily grave. The digger was coated with the black slimy oil and water and presented a bedraggled appearance but was full of flight despite his subterranean voyage.

SCHOOL BUDGET IS CARRIED 143-47, NO PROTEST FILED

The board of education is gratified at the overwhelming vote cast in favor of the public schools budget at last Wednesday's school budget election when the vote for was 143 and 47 against. Only property owners were entitled to vote at this election and there was little interest, as shown by the fact that only 199 persons voted.
 At the public meeting of the board held just prior to the opening of the election Wednesday afternoon to hear any protests to the tentative budget or any feature thereof, no opposition whatever developed. The attendance was small.
 The budget carries an appropriation of \$98,739 for the expenses of the current school year, which began the third Monday in June and ends the third Monday of next June.


REIMER ADDRESSES PEAR CONVENTION

Prof. F. C. Reimer, of the Southern Oregon Experiment station, returned yesterday from the great California Pear Growers' convention held at Berkeley. Prof. Reimer addressed the convention on the work which the experiment station is doing on Blight Resistant Pears. This was pronounced the largest fruit growers' convention ever held in California, and was a remarkable success from every standpoint.
 Professor Reimer also visited the leading pear districts of California, including the Sacramento and Santa Clara valleys.
 Over 90 per cent of the pear growers of that state now belong to the California Pear Growers' association, and this organization is doing a wonderful work for the industry.
