MAYOR GATES GETS ATTEMPTED 'BALL OUT' FROM BARBER

What is regarded as an important letter and intended call down of Mayor C. E. Gates and the city council by A. C. Barber, head of the State of Oregon Real Estate department at Salem, relative to the sale of 75 lots on paved streets taken over by the city for delinquent taxes, to ex-service men on easy terms, has just been received, probably inspired by the complaint of some Medford real estate dealer. It drew forth a firm reply from Mayor Gates.

Commissioner Barber's letter, addressed to the mayor is as follows: "Information has been obtained in this office that you are attempting to negotiate the sale of real estate. We do not find you are a licensed real estate broker and would thank you for an explanation of your activities. After reading this Mayor 'Pop' blow off much justifiable steam, tied cool wet cloths around his head and sitting down on a cake of ice, dictated the following reply, in part: "Your letter received, and in reply will state that as mayor of Medford, I have offered to the ex-service men any vacant lot in the city, which is owned by the city, at the cost of improvements and on very easy terms. "The city has a right to sell its own property without asking any one's permission, or taking out a license to do so. Seventy-five of these lots were sold within the first forty-eight hours."

LAKEVIEW RAILROAD REQUESTS TO QUIT

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24.—The Union Pacific railroad sought permission from the inter-state commerce commission today to acquire the Saratoga and Encampment railroad, a short line entirely within the state of Wyoming.

In another petition filed with the commission the Nevada-California Oregon railroad sought authority to abandon its narrow gauge railroad line running between Hackstaff and Lakeview on the Oregon-California border. Operating expenses for several years, the railroad said, exceeded the income.

SUPREME OWL HELD UNDER MANN ACT

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 24.—John W. Talbot, of South Bend, Ind., supreme president of the Order of Owls, a fraternal organization, was found guilty today by a federal court jury of violating the Mann act.

Fifteen of the 18 counts in the indictment were dismissed by District Attorney Frederick Van Nyp, but the three remaining charges accused Talbot of having induced, enticed and persuaded Pearl Bagley to go from Topeka, Kas., to South Bend, Ind., for immoral purposes.

THOMAS IN TALK AT GRANTS PASS ON IRRIGATION

"Give the settler upon the lands within your new irrigation project a square deal; make him satisfied and aid him in solving the problems that will confront him," said C. M. Thomas, of Medford, who spoke at the weekly luncheon of the chamber of commerce this noon.

Mr. Thomas has had a wide experience in the development of irrigation projects in southern Oregon, having represented three Jackson county projects in their formative period, and he told his audience today that there was work for every man to do in putting such a project as the one here into commission. And he started right in at the ground floor by calling for the "square deal" when he purchases and prospective settler appeared upon the ground; then he urged that assistance, financial if need be, be offered the home builder, and that his problems of production and of marketing be made the problems of the community.

Senator Thomas referred to another community where the farmer had been helped in the building up of a dairy herd, and he urged that much attention be given to the dairy industry in the building up of southern Oregon projects. He told of the offer made by institutions in the north to contract for a period of years for certain berry crops and of the assurance that the great firm of Libby, McNeil and Libby would establish a plant here when irrigation had assured sufficient production of certain varieties of crops. He urged that outlet through such sources was more to be sought than the establishment of smaller community canneries which would have to develop their own markets, the market as he noted, being as essential and often more difficult than the production.

Mr. Thomas was most optimistic over the results of irrigation in the Rogue River valley, and predicted that it would become the Eden of the country when once it had been brought under production.

Ralph P. Cowgill, project engineer of the Medford district, also present at the luncheon, predicted that the granite soils would some day hold the production records of the valley and noted his own experience with a farm developed from the purest of granite. His yields of alfalfa were the best in the upper valley districts, while vegetables and fruits were equal to the best. His farm had, in fact, become a show place of the Medford district—Grants Pass Courier.

Flying Auto Latest French Aero Wrinkle, Machine a Success

PARIS, Nov. 24.—A flying automobile is the latest development in the French aero world. A successful demonstration of an ordinary automobile with folding wings, two engines, one of ten horsepower for land going and the other of 300 horsepower for air travel was held recently at Buc, Seine-et-Oise. The machine performed all the usual feats of an airplane and also an automobile.
