NEW YORK, Nov. 26.—The two hour session on the stock exchange today was relatively the most active of any day this week. Transactions were on the basis of considerably more than 1,000,000 shares for a full session. The market gathered most of its strength from the spirited demand for rails, some of which rose to the year's highest levels. Equipments, oils and numerous specialties, particularly textiles and tobaccos, joined the comprehensive movement. Realizing for profits caused only moderate reactions in the final declines, the list closing with a strong tone. Sales approximated 500,000 shares. Decided strength also was shown by the bond list, in which a majority of the Liberty series established highest quotations of the year.
