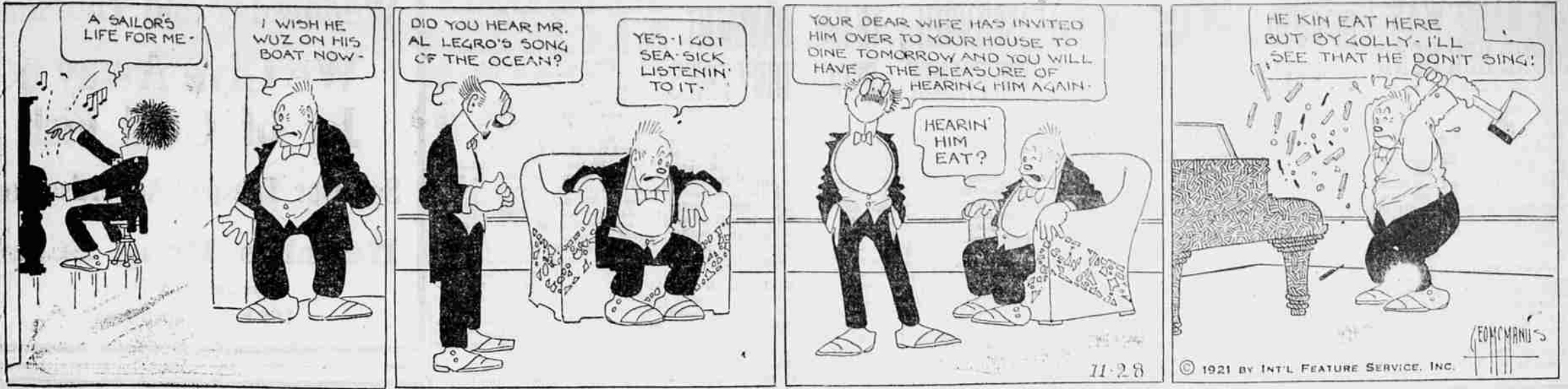


BRINGING UP FATHER

MISSING GOLD IS FOUND IN FIRE HOSE

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 28.—Part of the \$125,000 missing last week from the specie tanks of the liner Sonoma on her arrival in port here, a cache of \$27,800 in English sovereigns was found today in a piece of old fire hose hidden in a ventilator of the forward hold.

Only one member of the crew had access to this spot, according to officials of the steamship company. He was taken into custody and questioned immediately. Carl Knutson, first assistant engineer, discovered the gold while testing oil pipes.
