KANSAS WHEAT CROP LOWEST EVER KNOWN, MARKET IS BULLISH

CHICAGO, Nov. 29.—Reports that the condition of the Kansas winter crop is the lowest ever known for November, had a bullish effect on the wheat market today in the early dealings. Prospects of a liberal reduction of the visible supply total tended also to lift values. Initial quotations, which ranged from three-eighths to one cent higher, with December \$1.12 1/2 to \$1.13 and May \$1.16 to \$1.16 1/2, were followed by a moderate reaction and then by upturns higher than before.

Assertions that the close of navigation would bring about stoppage of export business in corn gave some advantage to bears in the corn market. After opening 1/4c lower to a like advance, with May at 54.5-5 to 55c, prices underwent a general sail. Oats were easy with corn, starting unchanged to 1-5c off, May 38 1/2 to 38.5-8c, and then declining all around.

Provisions developed strength as a result of absence of offerings.
