

STRUCTURES FOR ASHLAND WINTER FAIR UNDERWAY


ASHLAND, Nov. 29.—Buildings for the Winter Fair are now under way on grounds adjacent to the Nat. Everything is being gotten in readiness for next week, the dates being Dec. 7, 8, 9 and 10. In the way of helping along construction, Henry Moore, of the Dead Indian section, has donated 2000 feet of lumber for construction of sheds. Henry divides his time between a home residence in town and a ranch, and is one of the most persistent boosters in behalf of improvements either urban or suburban; hence this donation for the fairgrounds in way of equipment. For either moral or financial encouragement to help along any progressive movement, call on Henry. The show project will include a lot of attractions not included as strictly display exhibits. A carnival is scheduled for the closing date, when a halo of the romantic and sentimental will pervade the atmosphere, fully in keeping with what the term "carnival" implies. Other leading events apply to vaudeville specialties, which it is announced the ladies of the Civic Improvement club will stage. A number of side-shows, typical of the oldtime circus era, but all duly censored, may be introduced along the local midway pleasure. Poultry is going to be an important exhibit at the fair, and numerous prizes are offered in this department, both by local firms and outsiders. Portland firms are represented by C. H. Lilly, the Fischer Milling Co., also Kerr, Griffith & Co. Ashland donors handling flour and feed include Enders & Son, J. N. Dennis, Ashland Mills, the local Fruit association, and White House grocery. Many other firms will be added to the list, representing a wide range of industrial pursuits in addition to merchandising. Lowe—not D. M., but H. H.—of Butte Falls, is giving an impetus to rabbit exhibits by offering some very generous premiums.

Regrets are generally expressed over the defeat of the two mill tax which it was proposed to levy in behalf of improving the Lake of the Woods road. The vote was decisive, 40 for the proposed levy and 66 against. The only alternative seems to be individual subscriptions to help the project along. Some have the idea that the improvement is solely for benefit of cottagers at the lake, but as a matter of fact the Jackson county in general would profit thereby. Wood, grain, hay, and sawmill products come from that section. Individual subscriptions approximate \$200, with probably \$1000 in sight. If an energetic canvass was made before the lukewarm attitude discourages further effort. Several are ready to donate a month's work each on the highway, providing this offer is met by others in the spirit of a cash equivalent. With the advent of spring some definite action will be imperative.

Under the provisions of the Hancock act, the city has been very liberal in treatment of its citizens as to carrying their paving and sidewalk assessment obligations. Originally nearly \$300,000 was involved in these deferred payments. Even when delinquent the city was loth to foreclose without allowing the property owner every opportunity for redemption. Eventually several defaults occurred, principal and interest amounting to \$37,000. The properties which have actually reverted to the city number 16, which may be increased by the time of the spring tax sale. Of these properties about half a dozen have been disposed of at a fair price, and as has been heretofore stated the city is not disposed to take any unfair advantage in depriving property owners of their holdings; but on the other hand has been very lenient in regard to all matters through foreclosure proceedings, a plan adopted which has met existing conditions to the best possible advantage.

DESTRUCTION OF SCENIC BEAUTY IS LAMBASTED

Members of the Scenic Preservation Association attending the meeting held at Talent last evening adopted a strong resolution condemning the ruthless destruction of the scenic beauties of the Pacific highway on this side of the summit of the Siskiyou mountains and are sending a request to the state highway commission for immediate action toward saving as much as possible of the standing timber which still remains.

Citizens of Jackson county who have not been over this portion of the highway lately will be surprised at the devastation that has taken place. It is within the power of the state highway commission, by an act of the legislature at the recent session, to stop further destruction. Oregon as a state is permitting one of its greatest assets to get away from her by this ruthless destruction at her southern gateway. This scenery has given the tourists from the south their first impression of the state and the timber there impressed the stranger after the long run of the unattractive scenery of northern California.

The meeting was well attended and was preceded by a dinner given by the Ladies Aid society of Talent. C. M. Thomas was the speaker of the evening and he reviewed the history of the legislation which makes it possible to save the scenic sections along our highways. With good roads comes destruction, said Thomas, as they provide a means to get timber to market and unless quick action is taken by the state highway commission on the Siskiyou mountains an asset which it has taken hundreds of years to produce will in a few weeks be forever destroyed.

FROBACH NAMED ON SCENIC BOARD

At the request of Governor Olcott for the appointment of some one from Jackson county who he may appoint as a director in the proposed Scenic Preservation Association of the State of Oregon, the Jackson county association at their meeting at Talent elected H. O. Frobach to act in that capacity.

At the preliminary meeting held at Salem some time ago, a committee was appointed to draft a constitution and by-laws for the state association. As the Jackson county organization was the pioneer in the scenic preservation movement, its constitution and by-laws was used as a model.

A meeting for the formation of the State Scenic Preservation association will probably be called at Salem or Portland in January.


Nazimova Brilliant in "Camille"
