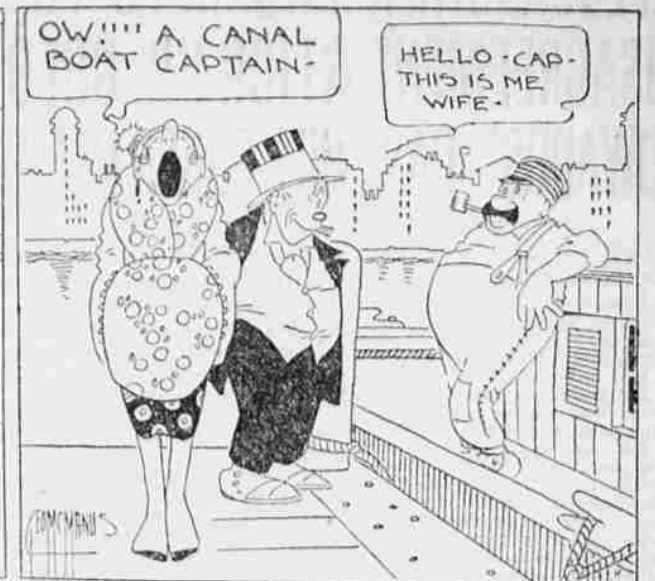
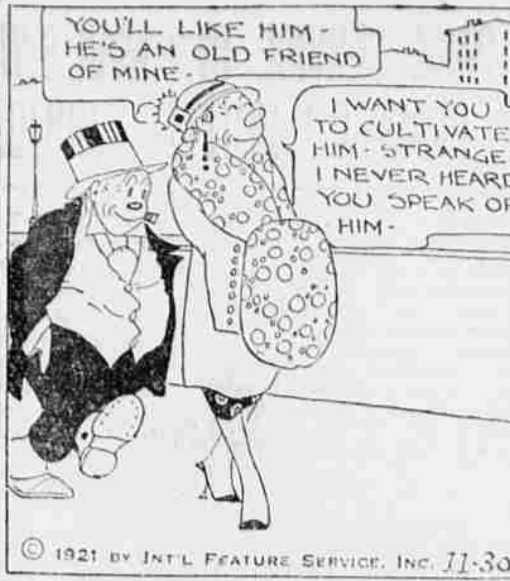
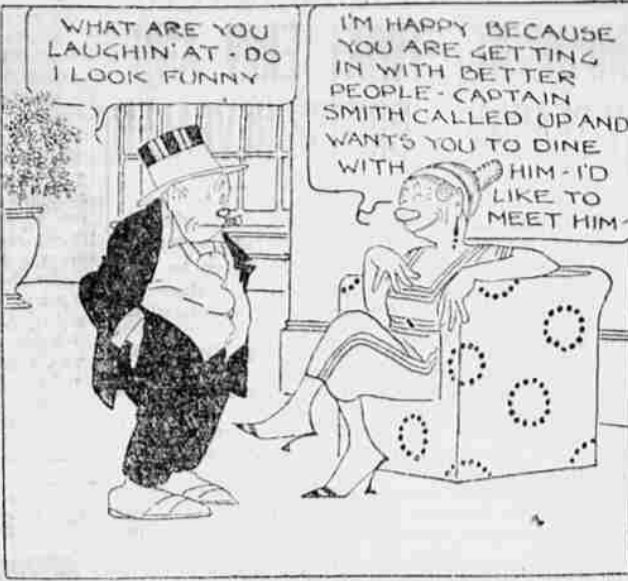

STATE PLANTS FOR WORKING PRISON INMATES URGED

OL. MPLA, Wash., Nov. 30.—First steps toward increasing industrial facilities in the penal institutions and asylums of Washington were taken at a conference of the heads of the state institutions here today and yesterday with Director R. E. Skaggs of the department of business control. It was agreed that an immediate survey would be made by the superintendents in response to suggestions made by John W. Pace, assistant director of the department who has made an extensive investigation of eastern institutions. The department hopes not only to train inmates for industrial work but to manufacture commodities for the markets, thus putting the institutions on a paying basis, it was said. According to Mr. Pace today, the penal institutions probably will be crowded this winter due to the business depression, but it is believed that the present equipment will care for the situation. A saving of \$65,000 was declared by Mr. Pace to have been made in the twelve institutions during the first six months of this biennium. This is the first of a series of conferences to be held every six months.

FINANCIAL RELIEF CORN BELT STATES

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 29.—Extension of at least \$200,000,000 of agricultural credits by the government's war finance corporation in the ten principal corn growing states of the middle-west is necessary for the orderly marketing of this year's big corn crop, Governor Warren T. McCray of Indiana estimated today after a meeting of the corporation's advisory committee of which he is chairman.
