

RUSSIANS DENIED ADMISSION TO U. S. DO NAKED DANCE

VANCOUVER, B. C., Dec. 1.—Three men from the Donkober, or Russian non-conformist settlement, near Nelson, B. C., descended all their clothing in a waiting room at the Canadian Pacific railway station here yesterday and paced off a provocative war dance when they were refused admittance to the United States. They were later arrested by Vancouver police for disorderly conduct.

United States Immigration Commissioner Zerkow had questioned them as to their fitness to proceed on their journey to the state of Washington as prospective settlers. He alleged that their views coincided with the accepted definition of philosophical anarchy and declined them hospitality of his government.

They are said to have threatened an address parade in Vancouver by a large number of their fellow Donkoberers in protest against their arrest.

This will take place at 7:30 and is a reminder of an important event to the buying public of this locality.

ITALIAN REDS GET EXECUTION STAY

DEDHAM, Mass., Dec. 1.—Superior Judge Webster Thayer today extended until December 20 the time allowed counsel for Nicola Sacco and Bartolomeo Vanzetti to file a petition based on exceptions taken by them during the trial in which the men were found guilty of murder in the first degree for the killing of a paymaster and his guard at South Braintree.

Decision of Judge Thayer in a motion for a new trial is still pending. Meantime sentence of the convicted men has been deferred.

For the first time in the nation, a governor has been recalled. This was the result of the North Dakota election in which Governor Lynn J. Frazier was defeated by Benwald A. Nestos, a lawyer, who was independent candidate. Governor Frazier was endorsed by the Non-Partisan League.

LABOR BOARD HAS PLAN TO SAVE RAILWAYS MONEY

CHICAGO, Dec. 1.—Two important changes and an estimated saving of \$50,000,000 to the railroads annually were the outstanding features of new working rules governing the 400,000 members of six federated railroad shop crafts as promulgated today by the United States railroad labor board.

The two chief changes were: Representation of minorities in presentation of grievances to meet the contention of the railroads that the old method virtually forced a closed shop.

Permission to apprentices to do certain repair work previously restricted to journeymen workers.

The new rules supplant the old national agreement, formulated by the United States railroad administration during the war, so far as the shopmen are concerned.

The rules hereafter will form the basis of adjudicating all wage disputes. They were adopted unanimously.

BEARS IN LEAD ON EARLY TRADING

CHICAGO, Dec. 1.—Bears in the wheat market had the advantage today during the early trading. Rates in Texas and in southern Argentina were reported here and were of influence. Opening quotations, which varied from unchanged figures to 5-8c lower, with December \$1.13 1/2, \$1.12 1/2 and May \$1.17 1/4 to \$1.17 1/2, were followed by a moderate upturn, which, however, proved transient.

Wet weather over the corn belt gave strength to the corn market. After opening unchanged to a quarter cent higher, May 54 1/4 to 54 7/8c, prices hardened all around.

Oats were firmer with corn. The market started unchanged to a quarter cent up May 28 1/2 to 28 5/8c and held near to the initial range.

Trading in provisions was virtually at a standstill, with quotations almost nominal.

U. S. DESTROYER RUNS AGROUND

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 1.—The United States destroyer DeLong, en route from San Diego to San Francisco, went aground early today at a point about ten miles south of the entrance to San Francisco harbor, according to wireless messages received here. The vessel and crew were reported not to be in immediate danger.

"Ship and all hands safe but need immediate assistance," said one message.

The destroyer Frederick was reported to have gone to the aid of the DeLong.

The point at which the DeLong is stranded is a rocky and dangerous strip about nine miles north of Point Pendro.

The DeLong, attached to destroyer division No. 14, is said to carry a crew numbering about 160 officers and men.

Death List Grows. FRED BLUFF, Cal., Dec. 1.—Charles Bluff, youthful driver of the Red Bluff high school bus which was struck yesterday by a Southern Pacific train at Proberta crossing, south of here, died in a hospital here early today. His death brought the number of dead as a result of the collision to twelve.

MOSCOW TO ADOPT TAXES TO KEEP UP CIVIC LIFE

MOSCOW, Dec. 1.—The Moscow city soviet (corresponding to an American city council) has decided that the city must be self-supporting and has published a schedule of new off duty taxes for revenue purposes. Among them are:

For marriage applications, 15,000 rubles; divorce applications, 20,000 rubles; change of name, 100,000 rubles; application for Russian citizenship, 10,000 rubles; application for foreign citizenship, 100,000 rubles; permission to change residence, 1,000 rubles; tax on concerts of lectures maintaining budget, 50,000 rubles; tax on rubber stamps used by business firms, 100,000 rubles.

As the official exchange rate, on the day these taxes were decreed, was 100,000 rubles to the dollar, an American in Moscow, armed with a \$5 bill could get married, be divorced, change his name, change his residence a few times, lecture on his home-town experiences, change his citizenship and own at least one rubber stamp without breaking another bank note.

The Russian Central Executive committee has ordered the Commissariat of Finance to arrange, within a fortnight, a budget showing the revenue obtained from taxation throughout Russia, together with a statement of the loss incurred from printing paper money.

SPECIAL FURNITURE FOR N. Y. OFFICIAL

NEW YORK, Dec. 1.—The seats of the city fathers will be dwarfed by comparison to Lilliputian size when Frank J. Dotzler, Republican alderman-elect from the 6th district, arrives with his specially constructed furniture next January 1.

Dotzler lists his weight in round numbers at 400 pounds, and finds it necessary to take with him his own private chair, which has a seating capacity of one square yard. The city had the chair built for him several years ago, when, upon his election to the Board of Aldermen, it was discovered that he could not squeeze into the regular seats. Dotzler bought it for \$1 when he retired, because the city was short of storage space.
