

ARKANSAS GOV. KEEPS PLEDGE NOT TO LEAVE STATE

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Dec. 2.—A pledge to himself that he would not leave the state during his incumbency, has caused Governor Thomas C. McRae of Arkansas to decline urgent invitations that he attend the annual conference of state governors at Charleston, S. C., in December.

Governor McRae's opinion that a chief executive of a state should not leave the state during his tenure in office was expressed freely during his campaign for governor, and although he did not make it a campaign pledge, he endeavored to leave the impression, he said, that only matters of gravest importance would cause him to go outside of Arkansas, if elected. Thus far he has not done so.

Three invitations to attend the governors' conference in Charleston have been received by Governor McRae, and rejected.

Another pledge made by the governor before his election was that he would not permit himself to become liable to criticism directed at other governors for the number of pardons issued. In almost a year as governor, he has issued only two pardons—one to a man who had finished his term, and one to a woman whose health demanded freedom.

JAPAN STATESMEN TO URGE SENTIMENT FOR ARMS PARLEY

TOKIO, Dec. 2.—A body of Japanese publicists including members of the two houses of the imperial diet, university professors, scholars, prominent publicists, journalists, business men and others, contemplate organization of an association for the purpose of directing the nation's sentiment toward the Washington conference.

The association will remain in ex-

istence throughout the session of the conference and will strive to support the attitude of the Japanese delegates. Efforts will be made to mould opinions along the following lines:

To insist upon the abolition of racial discriminatory treatment.

To insist on the prohibition of new defense work on the islands in the

Pacific which is calculated to form a threat to other countries.

To insist on the maintenance of the previously concluded treaties and agreements in existence among the powers and already accomplished facts.

To oppose the idea of international control of China.

The above enumerated principles will form the main features of a resolution to be submitted to the forthcoming general meeting of promoters of the plan and are expected to be adopted as the platform of the association.

Among the promoters appear the names of Vice Admiral Toqaya

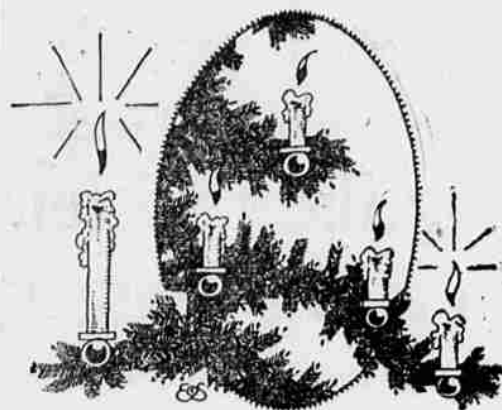

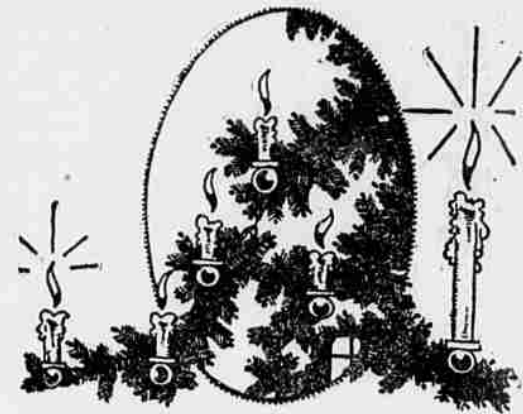
Congregational churches of America and after leaving the normal school, will make his home in Chicago.
