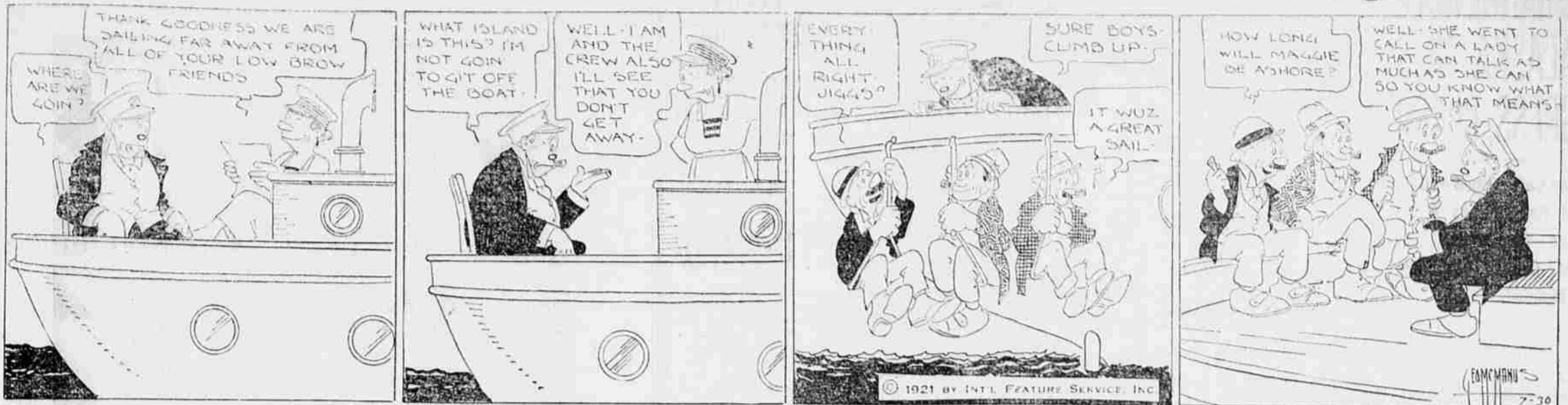

Ordinance No. 1218
AN ORDINANCE making the annual tax levy of the City of Medford, Oregon, for the year 1921.
THE CITY OF MEDFORD DOTH ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:
Section 1. There shall be levied for the year 1921 the following taxes upon the assessed valuation of all the taxable property in the City of Medford, Oregon, as shown by the assessment roll for Jackson County, Oregon, for the year 1921 for the following purposes, to-wit:
General Fund, including all departments of the mu-

municipal government, \$44,632.82 10.00 mills
Bond Sinking Fund, \$11,158.21 2.50 mills
Floating indebtedness, \$9,372.89 2.10 mills
Library Fund, \$6,892.27 1.30 mills
Total 15.90 mills
Section 2. It is hereby made the duty of the city recorder to certify to the county clerk and county assessor of Jackson County, Oregon, the levy made by this ordinance.
