WEST HAS MORE BOOZE THAN EAST, SKIRTS SHORTER

CHICAGO, Dec. 9.—The "wild and woolly" east was described today by Gilbert Traveller, of Champaign, N. M., a circuit rider for the Methodist Episcopal church for many years, who is attending a church gathering here.

"There was a time," he said, "when our grandmothers used to tell us tales of the terrors of the west, but now you have to come east for excitement. Some whiskey is drunk out there, but we don't have moonshine killings. Why, we haven't had a man in jail for six months."

Commenting on other things he said:

"The women on the streets here are a little different, too. Out west a child 12 months hangs onto its mother's skirt, but here they have to be three or four years old before they can reach that high."

Mr. Traveller rides a circuit of 2,000 miles. He said he believed that conditions in the west are better because the family is the unit.

REVISED RULES FOR RAILROADS DEC. 16

CHICAGO, Dec. 9.—Revised working rules for railway maintenance of way workmen will be promulgated December 14, to become effective December 16, it was announced by the United States railroad labor board today.

Due to the fact that many rules had already been agreed upon between the railroads and employees the board has made rapid progress. In a majority of cases not more than a half dozen rules were in dispute.

Completion of the maintenance of way rules will clear the board's docket of all rule cases pending, leaving them free to take up wage adjustment cases as soon as they are filed.

I. C. MAIL TRAIN IS ROBBED OF PAPERS

CAIRO, Ill., Dec. 8.—A mail car on Illinois Central passenger train No. 9 was robbed between Chicago and Centralia, Ill., some time last night for the fourth time in about three months. Details of the robbery are lacking. The train was en route from Chicago to Florida points.

CHICAGO, Dec. 8.—The Illinois Central mail car robbed between Cairo and Centralia last night contained only second class matter, consisting of papers and magazines, according to Illinois Central officials.
