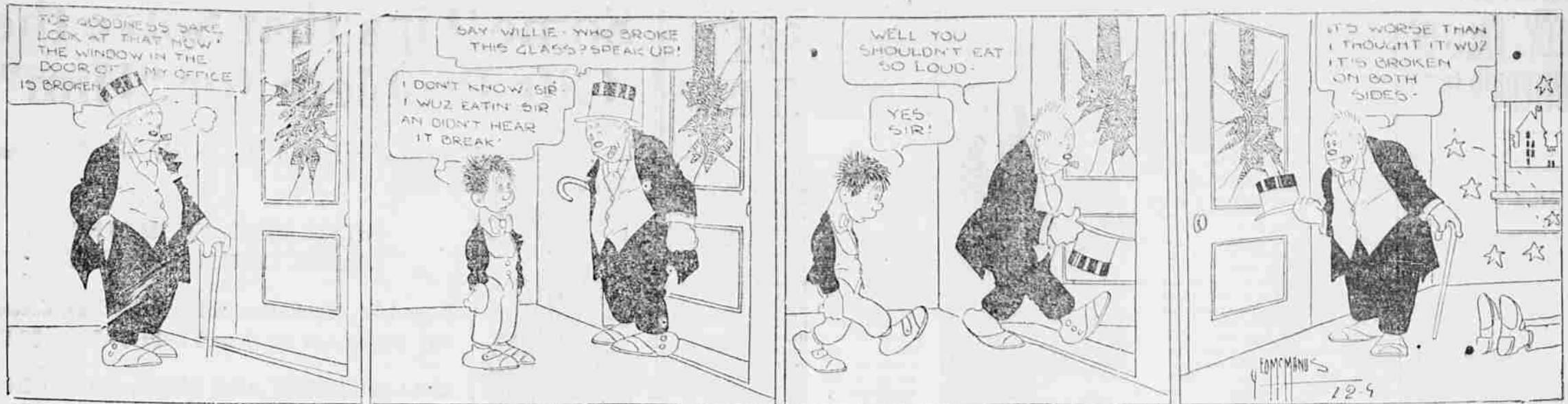

Commencing at the Northwest corner of Donation Land Claim No. Forty-one (41), in Township Thirty-eight (38) South, Range One (1) West of the Willamette Meridian, and running thence South 22.5 chains to the South line of the North Half of said Donation Land Claim No. 41, and thence East 32 chains to a point on the East line of the County Road, for a true point of beginning; thence East 12.00 chains to the East line of said Donation Land Claim No. 41; thence North 3.75 chains; thence East 21.83 chains, more or less, to the middle of Bear Creek; thence in a Northwesterly direction, along the middle of Bear Creek, 246.2 feet, more or less, to the Southeast corner of the 16 acre tract of land belonging to J.
