SKAGIT VALLEY IS INLAND LAKE FLEE TO HIGH PLACES

BRIDGEHAM, Dec. 11.—Thousands of persons on the banks of the Skagit river east of whom had no sleep last night, and at the same time, a heavy fog of water which estimated a thickness of thirty miles from Vancouver to Chinook mountains.

The Skagit river, which had risen to the highest point in recent years, flows through the delta in many places, cutting off communication between the lower river and the coast by boat and filling the valleys by the location, Lacomb, Conant, Milliken and Edson. The inundation with river towns will cut off the morning.

At Vancouver about 200 people in two suburban districts spent on Tuesday night an entire day in the water of the city. With them were cattle and horses which had been taken to high ground for safety.

Several families were stranded on the corner and station and the entire population of Vancouver, the valley south of Mount Vernon, was reported to be lying in the Great Northern railroad station. Bats were used to carry food to the stranded inhabitants. Yesterday afternoon the town of Lee Davis between Mount Vernon and Burlington was evacuated and built into two parts. Mrs. Davis and her three children who were in the house were rescued.

BIG LEAGUE HEADS PLAN BOYCOTT ON STUBBORN MINORS

NEW YORK, Dec. 11.—Club owners of the two big leagues indicated today before going into annual session that they would approve the suggestion made yesterday before the National League by Charles H. Fisher, president of the Brooklyn club, prohibiting purchase of players from minor-league owners in the event Fisher's proposition was to be voted upon today by the National League managers and it was suggested that the assistance and cooperation of the American League be secured. The American League would be further called upon to join in the boycotting of the two leagues on Thursday. Colonel E. J. Connelley, president of the New York Americans said they were favorably impressed with the idea.

Mr. Fisher's proposal specifically was a boycott of class AA and class A of minor league baseball players. The plan would be to sever the major leagues as a source of income from those minor league players that would be subject to the drafting agreement entered last January which will run for two years to 1923.

Important business before the American League owners included the new contract with Miller Huggins, manager of the Yankees, which Huggins probably will sign today. Huggins, it is said, insists on a two-year contract, while the club owners want to sign him for one year.

The recommendation of President Hooper before the National League that the major leagues take steps to prevent their own future competition from which to draw recruits has evoked favorable comment.

SIGNIFICANT MINING DEAL BY GOLD COIN

The principal and underlying idea of the various properties, such as the original Gold Coin group of claims, the Mos hawk group, the Allen group, the Red Ribbon group, etc., being held in trust temporarily, is to the end that the attorneys may have time to absolutely perfect title to said holdings prior to deciding to incorporate a body, which in turn comes within the purview of the corporate laws of the state of Nevada, which is a mining state having mining laws suitable to the aspirations of all who have the nerve to leave mother earth into coughing up her mineral contents, and of course the commonwealth of Oregon has as yet made no statutory provision against allowing a Nevada mining corporation from operating within the boundaries of this marvelous and wonderful mineral-bearing state of Oregon, provided of course you understand, that the said corporation pays for it; nor do they even have to come within the purview of the banking act—for the ostensible purpose of protecting the interests of the "dear people" of this infant state, for instance, same as the Jacksonville Bank, etc. Said Gold Coin trustees have through their attorneys taken the initial step toward the formation of a corporation under the laws of the state of Nevada, which will in due course be completed, and thereupon the various said holdings will be properly conveyed to said corporation, fully paid for and partially developed,—at least they have been developed to such a point that the expense of the owners thereof, that sufficient rich ore is blocked out to justify the erection of a mill at once, and instead of the original plan of calling for additional subscribers to the stock of the Gold Coin Mining corporation now being formed, we shall proceed to the plan of making gold bricks. Subsequently we shall modestly enter into the gleeful pursuit of happiness by dividing the profits amongst ourselves.
