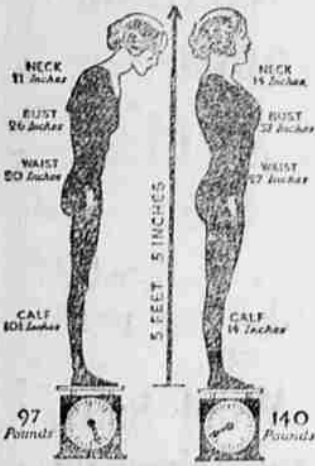

FEDERAL BONUS TO SOLDIERS UP IN CONGRESS JAN. 1

WASHINGTON, Dec. 14.—The house war and marine committee with the tariff and tax revision of its hands for the revenue bill, will take up the soldier bonus question immediately after the adjournment of the House today, according to Chairman Fordney announced today that the committee's first order of business for the new year would be consideration of adjusted compensation legislation. Its primary concern, he added, would be to determine how funds with which to pay a bonus can be raised.

The opinion appears to be general that any bill must provide a means of raising the funds it intends to distribute.

Among the proposals now being put forward as a means of raising bonus funds is either a manufacturers tax or a general business sales tax. It is also contended by some that if a bonus is voted, it should in some way be linked up with settlements by foreign nations of the debt owed the United States.

House leaders said today there was a growing demand among members, most of whom will stand for re-election next fall, for disposal of the bonus question at an early date.

HILTED FARMER IN FRENZY MURDERS SCHOOL TEACHER

WATERLOO, Ia., Dec. 14.—Evel Throat, 24 years old, confessed today according to the authorities that he killed Mrs. Inez Mammison, nearly 22-year-old school teacher, near Des Moines, Monday, because she had rejected his love.

Throat, a childhood acquaintance of the slain teacher, who was beaten and strangled to death in the school house where she taught, was arrested at Des Moines, 20 miles from the scene, late yesterday. He journeyed there on the back of a horse, alleged to have been stolen.

When brought to jail here a large crowd gathered but no violence was attempted.

Throat said he and Mrs. Mammison were to have been married December 17 but that another man had intervened in their love affair. The girl's father for him called Throat said.

The story was told according to county authorities after Throat had been interrogated for four hours. They alleged Throat said:

"I couldn't sleep Sunday night and spent most of the night walking around the vicinity of Des Moines. I went to the school house Monday afternoon. The children had all gone home and Inez was alone. We quarreled in the school room. She went to the basement to fix the fire for the night. I followed and we quarreled again. I picked up a stick and struck her over the head. She turned around again and I hit her two or three times. Then I left. She did not fight back."

Throat said he did not think Mrs. Mammison was dead when he left her.

There were about 60 young people present.

In view of the pending action by the city council upon a curfew ordinance, therefore be it resolved:

1. That we, the members of the Epworth League of the First Methodist Episcopal church, assembled for regular services, Sunday evening, Dec. 12, 1921, do hereby request the council of the city to act favorably upon the said ordinance.

2. And be it further resolved that copies of this resolution be sent to the city council and the several papers of the city.

He leaves, besides his wife, one daughter, Edith, and one brother, L. L. Jacobs of Medford, also one sister, Mrs. Mary Lettome of Canby, Wash.

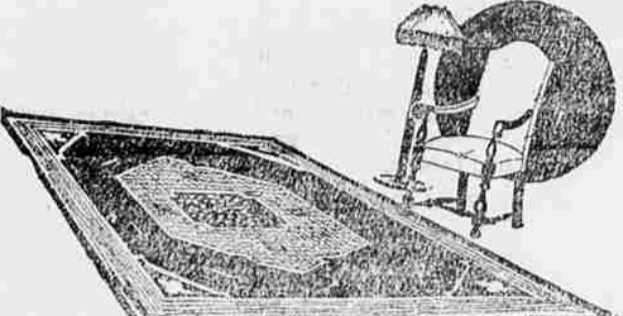
