On one occasion, challenging the girls to a contest in ticket selling, the boys beat the sale materially and won out in the contest also. It may not be generally known, but the famous "Tonerville Trolley" of the Armistice Day parade was the work of the H-Y club. Incidentally, the float won a first prize of ten dollars.

Considerable fun has been enjoyed at the initiatory ceremony, when an several resolutions follows not so-called enough to get in as charter members. 
