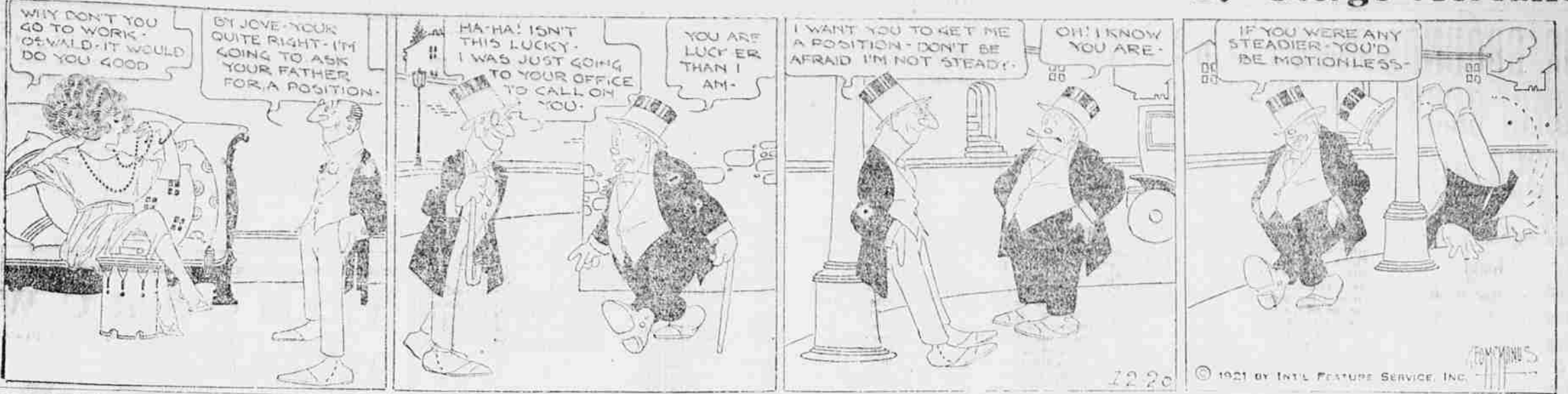

Chicago Report
 CHICAGO, Dec. 20.—Lack of moisture in the southwest together with a forecast of zero temperatures as far south as northern Kansas, had a tendency to strengthen the wheat market today during the early trading. Up-Grain in price, however, led to selling on the part of houses with northwest-ern connections. Taken as a whole, business was wanting in volume and the market was easily influenced. Opening quotations, which varied from unchanged figures to 3-8c higher, with May \$1.14 1/2 to \$1.15 and July \$1.04 to \$1.04 1/2, were followed by slight gains all around and then something of a reaction.
 Corn and oats were easy in the absence of any special demand. After opening unchanged to 3-8c lower, May 53 1/2 to 53 3/8c the corn market sagged a little all around.
 Oats advanced a quarter cent off to 1/2c advance, May 38 3/8c and later showed a slight general setback.
 Provisions reflected steadiness of the hog market.
