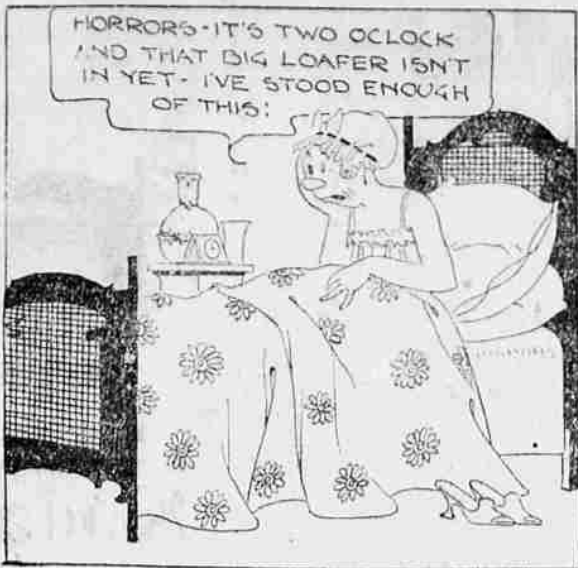

SUGAR COLLAPSE IN CUBA DUE TO PLANTER'S GREED

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21.—A duty of two cents a pound on Cuban raw sugar as compared with the present emergency rate of 1.6 cents and the one cent in the Underwood tariff law was asked of the senate finance committee today by the United States Sugar Manufacturing association through G. W. McCormick, a beet sugar manufacturer of Menominee, Mich.

American beet sugar producers must have five cents a pound for the finished product f.o.b. factory. Mr. McCormick said, and since Cuban raw sugar can be laid down at the refineries in this country at two cents a pound a 2-cent duty is necessary unless the beet sugar industry is to be destroyed.
