HELENA, Mont., Jan. 5.—Over the vigorous protest of Governor J. M. Dixon, the state board of examiners have voted to hold the state fair this year, and if necessary, cut the appropriation.

Attorney General Hankin declared the holding of the exposition was not within the province of the board, but was mandatory under the law.

Governor Dixon told the board and the commercial club committee the fair should not be held because of the state's financial condition.
