THE LEAGUE STILL BREATHES.

THE meeting of the council of the League of Nations at Geneva today, calls attention to the fact that the League in Europe is still alive.

Tuesday was its second birthday. In this time the league has grown from a membership of 13 to 51 states, the largest collection of states ever brought together.

While the important business of world readjustment is taking place at Cannes, on one hand, and at Washington on the other, the fact should not be forgotten that the league machinery is still intact, that certain concrete things have been accomplished, and that nothing is dead until it is buried.

The first potential conflict settled was that between Sweden and Finland over the Aland Islands, when the sovereignty of the islands was given Finland with neutralization for ten years.

Second was the upper Silesia dispute when the league was influential in preventing hostilities threatened by Zeligowski's seizure of Vilna, and offered a settlement which is still being negotiated.

Third was the Upper Silesia dispute between Great Britain and France and temporarily adjudicated by the league, and fourth the Jugo-Slav invasion of Albania, which was halted by a threat of an economic blockade which Lloyd George made through the league.

The league as at present constituted may not live, but this much is certain its essential spirit, the substitution of negotiation for war, is alive today and will not die. Whether the United States eventually joins the league or whether the league is eventually absorbed by a more loosely constituted concert, headed by the United States the fact remains that the soul of the league, like John Brown's body, is destined to go marching on.

NEW AUTO TAGS TO BE REQUIRED JANUARY 20TH

The lid will not be clamped down on delinquent applications for the 1922 automobile license plates before January 20. A letter forwarded by Secretary of State Koser to police officials throughout the state today indicates that this date will be the earliest on which the automobile registration department will be able to dig itself out from under the deluge of applications for license plates which flooded the department on the closing days of the old year.

Even with this 20 days of grace which is being allowed the tardy applicants before the law governing the use of license plates is enforced, hundreds of motorists will be caught without the yellow and black plates of the 1922 season when the time limit now set has expired.

Although several thousand applications have been received since the first of the year, to be added to the approximately 50,000 which were in on the appointed time there are still several thousand of the 1920 automobile owners in Oregon who have as yet made no move toward securing their plates for the new year. It will be to these that the traffic squad of the secretary of state's department of the police officials throughout the state will direct their attention when the final day of grace has expired and orders go forth to round up the delinquents on or about January 20.
