GEORGES' STOCK SOARS AGAIN WITH VICTORY OVER COOK

LONDON, Jan. 12.—(By Associated Press) Georges Carpentier, who decisively defeated George Cook of Australia last night, may ask another fight with Jack Dempsey, world's champion heavy-weight after meeting Ted (Kid) Lewis, the Evening Standard was informed today by Francois Des-camps, Carpentier's manager.

LONDON, Jan. 13.—Georges Carpentier's decisive victory over George Cook, the Australian heavyweight, in Albert Hall last night is looked on in sporting circles as definitely disposing of recent reports that the European champion was in poor physical condition. Cook put up a game fight for three rounds, but the superior ring generalship of the Frenchman, combined with his carefully trained condition, soon told and the Australian went down for the count in the fourth.
