## R. RIVER PASTOR GIVES SERIES OF BIBLE LECTURES

ROGUE RIVER, Jan. 23.—Dr. Wolfe of the Presbyterian church at Rogue River is at present delivering a series of lectures on the subject, "Is the Bible the Word of God?" He thinks the church has to come back to the old fundamentals or lose her power. In a stirring address last Sunday morning which brought forth many discussions, pro and con, he laid claim to the proof that the old Testament is the word of God, and announced that next Sunday he will take up the New Testament. In the course of his address last Sunday, he said: "When I decided to settle this matter in my own mind I asked myself, 'What does my Lord and Master have to say about it. There is positive proof that Jesus Christ declared the entire Old Testament to be the Word of God. There are people who say they cannot take the Bible as a whole, but they accept the teachings of Jesus Christ. Such a statement is absolutely irrational. If you accept Jesus Christ you must accept all the Bible, and I shall prove it before I get through with this series of lectures. Today let us look at the Old Testament. After discussing the Law of Moses in the 7th chap. of Mark in the 13th verse he declares it to be the word of God. It is the law of Moses our higher critics attack first, as the 'mistakes of Moses.' If that portion stands all will stand. Next they jump on Isaiah. But we find Jesus opening the book of Isaiah, reading from it, and declaring, 'This day is this Scripture fulfilled.' But it must be remembered that the Old Testament stood in the days of Christ practically as it stands now, and in John 5:39 he said: 'Ye search the Scriptures' referring to the entire Scripture. Some one said you certainly cannot prove the New Testament through Christ, for it was not written till after Christ. I have not time to discuss that part this morning, but will prove it next Sunday. In the meantime let me plead with you, do not take from me the old Bible, that precious book of my sainted mother. I am trying to live by it and I want to die by it. O let me pillow my head on this precious book when my Christ and the angels of God lead me on to the Glory world. Do not, O do not rob me of the hope it gives me. There are a lot of people who think this book is good enough to die by. My friends if it is good enough to die by let us also live by it." Last month Dr. Wolfe delivered a series of lectures on the Deity of Christ which caused quite a stir, and many requests have come to him for their publication. These lectures on the "Bible by the Word of God" will continue the next four Sunday mornings in the Presbyterian church. This church has recently put up one of the finest buildings in the county for the young people and as a community center.

## Water Permits in Jackson County

In Jackson county, the following permits have been issued: To L. J. Grisson of Lake Creek, Oregon, covering the appropriation of water from Cold Spring Creek and Lucky Canyon Creek for irrigation of fifteen acres. To J. L. Goodwin, and D. Barnes of Applegate, Oregon, covering the appropriation of water from Hinkle Gulch for mining purposes, necessitating an expenditure of approximately \$500. To G. W. Frey, of Lake Creek, covering the appropriation of waste and seepage water from Long Gulch for irrigation of a ten-acre tract. To Calvin Lane Dusenberry of Gold Hill, covering the appropriation of water from Sardine Creek for irrigation of a six-acre tract and for domestic water supply. To H. Grisson, of Lake Creek, covering the appropriation of water from Lost Creek for domestic supply and for irrigation of fifteen acres. To F. T. Lawrence and D. R. Eaton of Gold Hill, covering the use of water from Bear Gulch spring for irrigation of a ten-acre tract and for domestic water supply. This development will cost approximately \$450. To the Lamolle County Savings Bank and Trust Company of Medford covering the appropriation of water from Little Butte Creek for the irrigation of 169 acres in Jackson county. The estimated cost of the irrigation system, including one mile of canal, amounts to \$2,000. To Laura O. Gault of Jacksonville, covering the appropriation of water from Little Applegate river for irrigation of 25 acres, at a cost of \$1,500. To S. R. McConathy, of Jacksonville, covering the use of water from Little Applegate River for irrigation of a three-acre tract, at a cost of \$1,500. To E. S. Nelson of Jacksonville, covering the appropriation of water from Little Applegate river for irrigation of a ten-acre tract involving an expenditure of approximately \$1,500. During 1921, 422 permits to appropriate water were issued by Percy A. Cupper, state engineer, under which it is proposed to irrigate 33,394 acres of land, develop 7,749 horsepower and supply the cities of Lakeview, Warrenton, Crawford Point, Myrtle Creek, Myrtle Point and Elk City with municipal water supply. The permits also include the appropriation of water for domestic, stock, mining, fluming lumber, log ponds, etc., and the storage of 11,344 acre feet of water in 28 different reservoirs. The incomplete estimated cost for construction work amounted to \$2,683,000. During the past year nearly \$2,000,000 were expended by Oregon irrigation districts in construction work and work is now under way on four irrigation districts which will involve the expenditure of additional funds amounting to \$700,000. Irrigation district bonds in the amount of \$2,347,000 were certified during 1921, and contracts were entered into for the payment of interest by the state on irrigation district bonds in amount of \$4,375,000. The U. S. reclamation service is definitely committed to the construction of the Lower Powder Valley Project for the irrigation of some 60,000 acres of land and during 1921 expended considerable money on the various units of the Klamath and Umatilla Projects.

## G. N. AGENT DIES EFFECT OF WOUND BY NEGRO CONVICT

WENATCHEE, Wash., Jan. 25.—E. P. Savage, special agent for the Great Northern railway, who was shot last Sunday by an escaped negro convict, died Monday at Leavenworth, Wash. The negro who is being held in jail here awaiting to be taken to the Monroe reformatory, will be charged with manslaughter, officers stated. Gangrene setting in in the wound on Savage's leg caused his death. The negro, Daniel Jones, was picked up at Leavenworth by the officers on suspicion, after they had received a circular warning them to be on the lookout for an escaped negro from the Monroe institution. At the police station while Jones was being searched he obtained possession of Chief of Police Brown's pistol and started firing, hitting both Brown and Savage, but was later overpowered.

## CHILE OBJECTS TO ECUADOR INVITE

SANTIAGO, Chile, Jan. 25.—(By the Associated Press.)—The proposed conference in Washington between representatives of Peru and Chile will become non-effective as far as Chile is concerned; if Bolivia's request that she be permitted to participate in the negotiations is accepted by the United States government. This statement of Chile's position was given by Foreign Minister Jara to the correspondent. He asserted that Chile had accepted the invitation of the Washington government to a conference to deal with clauses of the treaty of Ancon which only affects Chile and Peru. Chile's plenipotentiaries to meet Peru's representatives in Washington were to be named today at a cabinet meeting.
