DECLARES R. ROADS NOT TURNED BACK IN POOR CONDITION

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24.—Assertions that the railroads were turned back to their owners after the period of government control in a broken down condition, were refuted today by Walker D. Hines in a statement before the senate inter-state commerce committee in which the former director-general of railroads said he believed the government had "substantially over-maintained the equipment" of the roads.

Mr. Hines told the committee as a witness in its general railroad inquiry that reports at the end of federal control showed locomotives to be in "distinctly better" condition than at the beginning, and the condition of freight cars to "compare favorably" with that time. It must be remembered, he added, that both generally were in exceedingly poor condition at the beginning of federal operation.

WOULD END FEUD OF COUNTRY BANKS

WASHINGTON, Jan. — Chairman McFadden of the house banking and currency committee has introduced a bill which he declared was designed to dispose of "the fight between the country banks and the federal reserve banks pertaining to par collection of checks."

The measure provides that a bank not a member of the federal reserve service may elect whether it will make an exchange charge when remitting for checks drawn upon it, but if the bank decides to do so, it will be required to pay a similar charge for the service rendered by the federal reserve banks in the collection of such checks.

BIG AUTO RACES AT S. F. ARMISTICE DAY

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. — Plans are announced here favoring a 599-mile automobile race on next November 11, Armistice Day, at the greater San Francisco speedway at San Carlos. A purse of \$50,000 and lap prizes of at least \$25,000 will be offered.

Local automobile men say the \$75,000 prize alone will be the largest sum ever offered in a race. Cars smaller than the racing cars now being used will be entered in the Armistice Day race, the officials having announced that 22-inch motors will be given handicaps which will enable them to compete against the larger cars (185 cubic inches displacement).

DR. WORK IS PROBABLE SUCCESSOR TO HAYS

WASHINGTON, Jan.—Dr. Hubert Work, first assistant postmaster general, as a matter of formality, has submitted his resignation along with that of his chief, Postmaster General Hays, it became known today.

Dr. Work is generally thought to be one of those prominently under consideration for the postmaster generalship in succession to Mr. Hays, who will retire next March 4.

GERMANY HAS BECOME NATION CAKE EATERS

BERLIN, Jan. — Germans have become a nation of cake eaters, as a result of the habits formed during the war. Cake making is now a Saturday afternoon community affair. In all the smaller cities and in every section of Berlin, the housewives carry the cake dough to the community bakery every week end and lay in a supply for the following week.

Hold Irish Olympiad PARIS, Jan.—(By the Associated Press.)—"An Irish Olympiad" will be held in Dublin next August, following the Irish horse show, under the auspices of the International Irish league, organization of which was decided upon at today's session of the world congress of the Irish race.

16,652 OFFICERS WILL BE NEEDED FOR U. S. FORCES

WASHINGTON, Jan.—A study of the military establishment just completed by the staff has resulted in the decision that 16,652 commissioned officers will be needed for ultimate requirements, when the regular service is fully officered in each grade, the national guard is perfected under federal regulations and the organized reserves are finally completed, while the estimated number to July 1 next year, is fixed at 13,000.

A summary of the ultimate requirements shows that 2251 officers will be needed for administrative functions essential to mobilization, for the educational system; for professional development of officers and enlisted men, specialists, 2260 are required; for duty with the national guard, organized reserves, training centers and reserve officers training, 3344 are needed, and for duty with the regular army in the United States, immediately available for an emergency, 2061.

The coast defenses are allowed 610 and 2854 are required for insular garrison, including the Philippines, Hawaii, Panama Canal and Porto Rico.

WAITE HOYT TAKES UP MARRIAGE VOWS

NEW YORK, Jan. 27.—Waite Hoyt, who pitched the New York Yankees to two victories in the world's series with the pennant winning giants last fall accompanied Miss Dorothy H. Pyle, 23, of Brooklyn to the Brooklyn marriage license bureau yesterday and took out credentials for signing a life contract. He gave his age as 23, but refused to say when he planned taking the critical step.

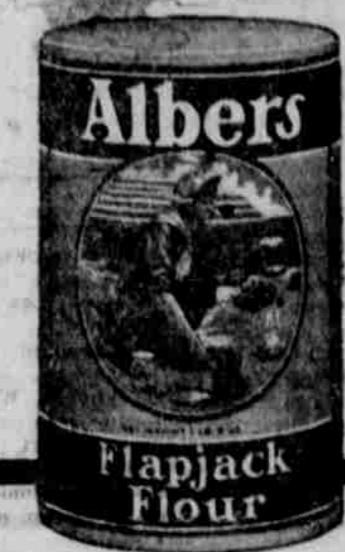
