

FINAL TRIBUTE PAID HONORED LOCAL CITIZEN

Final tribute was paid this afternoon to the memory of William S. Crowell, in an impressive funeral service held at the Weeks-Conger chapel, and largely attended by friends and associates in political and business activities, comrades of the Civil War and those who knew him well. The last sad rites were conducted by the First Church of Scientists, of which he was a member. The body will be taken to Portland tonight for cremation, accompanied by his first friends, Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Berrian.

From one to 3:15 o'clock, all that was mortal of the beloved citizen lay in state, and was viewed by a sorrowing line. The casket was banked with floral offerings.

The G. A. R. Post, the I. O. O. F. lodge and Order of the Eastern Star attended in a body, organizations in which Judge Crowell had been active in his life time. The funeral procession was headed by the G. A. R. comrades, bearing the national colors.

In the services, Mrs. H. A. Thierolf, accompanied by Miss Sadie Loey sang "No Night There."

The active pallbearers were men from the four banks of the city: W. H. Gore and John S. Orth of the Medford National, Delroy Getchell and Fred E. Wahl of the Farmers and Fruitgrowers bank, C. W. McDonald and George Lindley of the Jackson County bank, and E. G. Harter and Orris Crawford of the First National bank.

The honorary pallbearers were Attorneys Porter J. Neff, Mahlon Purdin, N. W. Borden, Gus Newbury, H. A. Canaday, C. M. Thomas, T. W. Miles and Judge F. M. Calkins.

COPENHAGEN, Feb. 3.—The conference of the International Wrestling union has been set for March 3 at Stockholm. During the next four days the world's wrestling championships will be decided. Invitations to compete have been sent to the United States and other nations.

ACQUITTAL IN MOTHER-IN-LAW ASSAULT CASE

Charles Bossum, local man, was found not guilty this morning in Justice Taylor's court on a charge of assault and battery filed by his mother-in-law, Mrs. Alabama Little. Mrs. Little accused Bossum of striking her in the face following an argument over an agreement which Bossum had made with her concerning the furnishing of certain household necessities in return for keeping his step-daughter and sending the child to school.

Several witnesses testified that they saw Bossum strike Mrs. Little, but that she had attempted to strike him first. Bossum declared that he did not strike her and only attempted to defend himself by throwing his arms in front of his face and catching her by the wrists.

From the testimony of the five witnesses who appeared, the court decided that Mrs. Little had been the aggressor by attempting to strike Bossum and by calling him a liar and that the defendant was not guilty.

The case was dismissed and the plaintiff was warned by Judge Taylor to bring no more family quarrels into court.

FRANCE SETS DOWN TERMS FOR GENOA

LONDON, Feb. 3.—(By the Associated Press.)—The note prepared by Premier Poincaré defining the conditions under which, from the French viewpoint, the international economic conference at Genoa shall open, declares the inclusion of soviet Russia may be fraught with considerable danger unless the allies agree in advance on a common attitude toward the soviet delegates.

M. Poincaré considered the agenda for the conference, as arranged by the supreme council at Cannes too vague. It must be made clear, he says, that article two, labelled "establishment of European peace on a solid basis," shall not in any way affect existing treaties for example, shall not serve as the pretext for the reopening of the Silesian or reparations questions.

EARTHQUAKE ONLY 250 MILES AWAY

NEW YORK, Feb. 1.—(By Associated Press.) The huge "fault" in the earth's crust which first occurred beneath San Francisco bay, the memorable catastrophe in 1906, has become a few hundred miles longer.

This was the explanation today of Dr. Chester A. Reeds, professor of geology and seismographic observer at the American museum of natural history, for yesterday's violent earthquakes.

The earthquake took place at a point beneath the bed of the Pacific ocean about 250 miles west of Portland, Ore., and was an earth movement slipping along the fault plane known as the San Andreas rift," said Dr. Reeds.

TROTSKY VETOES LENINE PROPOSAL

COPENHAGEN, Feb. 1.—(By the Associated Press.)—The central executive committee of the soviet government has rejected a proposal by Nikolai Lenine that the Russian army be reduced by half, according to a Moscow dispatch to the Society Democrat by way of Berlin.

Lenine's proposal was made with a view to meeting the wishes of the United States, but it was opposed by Leon Trotsky.

AMERICAN DOGS WIN TEAM RACE

LANCASTER, N. H., Feb. 3.—American dogs driven by Arthur T. Walden of Wonalancet, N. H., won the honors today in the second day's lap of the eastern international 120 mile dog team race. On the 36 mile run here from Colbrook, they defeated Jen Lebel of Bermsis, P. Q., and his mongrel combination by 27 minutes.

CORVALLIS, Ore., Feb. 3.—Six mat men have been picked by Coach Rathbun to represent the Aggies against University of Oregon at Eugene tonight. Four of the six are new men. Iulton and Coyner are the last year's men who will make the trip.

EUGENE, Ore., Feb. 2.—Francis Beller, star varsity basketball guard, will probably not be in the line-up which Coach George Bohler sends against the Aggies here tonight and Saturday night. Beller has been ill since the last game with Stanford.

(Continued from Page One) Investigators suggesting that the man who had been nervously smoking cigarettes while waiting for an opportunity to get at Taylor apparently entered the apartment at that time. Miss Edna Purcell, motion pic-

ture actress who occupies a bungalow in the same group of buildings, informed the police that she returned home about midnight Wednesday and observed lights burning in Taylor's home. She said she was awakened the following morning by screams of Taylor's negro valet who upon reporting for work at Taylor's home discovered the body of his employer and fled shrieking.

Directed Mary Pickford

Taylor had directed many actors prominent in the film world, including Mary Miles Minter and Mary Pickford. Miss Normand last night denied a report she had been engaged to marry Taylor, but later, according to another newspaper interviewer, stated they had once been engaged, but had decided to "be merely friends." She said he had helped her with her reading and her study of French.

Leading directors and others in the industry are said to be planning to offer a reward for the arrest and conviction of Taylor's slayer.

The search by police for Edward Sands, former valet-secretary of Taylor, for whom warrants on charges of grand larceny were obtained by Taylor several weeks ago, extends to Fresno and Sacramento, according to the police, although Sands was known to have been here recently.

Jewelry stolen from Taylor's residence was pawned in Fresno and Sacramento and the pawn tickets, with Christmas and New Year's greetings were returned by mail to Taylor. Taylor in reporting this to the police recently, said he recognized the handwriting as that of Sands.

Valet Robbed House Sands, according to a report made a year ago by Taylor, on his return from Europe, robbed him of jewelry, clothing and a motor car. Sands, Taylor

then reported, had been in charge of the Taylor house and had taken many things and money. A warrant on two charges of grand larceny was issued August 3.

The second robbery of the house reported to the police was several weeks ago. The rear door was smashed in and the place thoroughly ransacked and a stock of distinctive gold tipped cigarettes and jewelry taken, according to the report to the police. A week later the negro house man found a gold tipped cigarette of this variety on the doorstep, which Taylor reported to the police as indication that the robber had re-visited the scene.

This was followed by receipt of a letter signed "Alias Jimmy V.," apparently posted in Sacramento, in which pawn tickets of jewelry pawned in Fresno and Sacramento were enclosed.

IRISH CONCORD BROKEN (Continued from Page One) Collins yesterday the difficulties re-

garding the Ulster boundaries have been revived in intensified form.

"When the treaty was entered into between the British government and representatives of southern Ireland, we in Ulster were not consulted. We faced the possibility of a loss of territory without our consent,—territory solemnly assured to us as an established government by his majesty the king and the parliament of Great Britain. I endeavored to find a solution of the difficulty, earnestly trying to bring about an honorable peace in an honorable way.

"I am offering to lay my views before the whole British cabinet and will consult my colleagues in our local parliament and in the imperial parliament regarding the steps to be taken in consequence of the serious situation,—one which is not of my making, but which I earnestly tried to avoid."

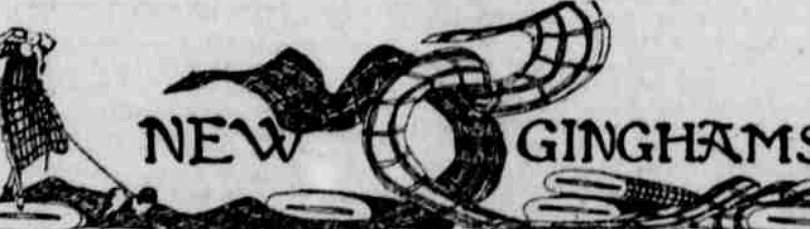
