MARSHFIELD, Feb. 11.—A meeting of the Unipika Baptist association was held here Thursday night for the purpose of taking action to annul the ordination of Rev. Jesse T. Anderson, former pastor of the Marshfield Baptist church, whose disappearance last summer created a sensation. The action of the association deprives Anderson of any of the rights as a minister of the gospel or of the Baptist denomination.

NEW YORK, Feb. 11.—With a double holiday ahead and increasing dissatisfaction occasioned by prospective tax legislation, today's brief session of the stock market was dull and uncertain of tone. Shorts covered moderately in rails and some of the representative industrials, but the general list, particularly low priced miscellaneous issues, denoted an absolute lack of interest. Prices rallied slightly in the final dealings on buying of Mexican Petroleum and Peoples Gas. The closing was irregular. Sales approximated 275,000 shares. Liberty issues and other active bonds showed nominal gains and losses.
